## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 24th February, 1928, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 27th February, 1928, to Saturday, the 3rd March, 1928, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made

to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft, on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

## REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR SITUATIONS IN THE JUNIOR GRADE OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE CLASS.

*Competitions under these regulations are open both to men and women.*

*These regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.*

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 22 and must not have attained the age of 24 on the first day of August in the year in which the Examination is held.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz. :—

(a) Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

(b) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. No person will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject and the child of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of persons serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners and provided that exception may be made as regards the father in the case of Candidates who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

3. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the Examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the Examina-

No Candidate may offer in Sections A and C together two languages of the group Italian, Spanish, Portuguese, or two of the group Norwegian, Swedish, Danish.

Only a Candidate who takes two modern languages in Section B may offer Latin or Ancient Greek as an auxiliary language.

7. In subjects 50 to 65 the civilization subject associated with a language can only be taken by Candidates who offer the language itself for examination in Section B.

LINCOLN CORPORATION GAS.

The land hereinbefore referred to is:—

A piece of land containing 10a. 3r. 0p. or thereabouts belonging or reputed to belong to Frederic Thomas Tanqueray and leased by him to and occupied by the Corporation as allotment gardens, situate at Bracebridge, in the City of Lincoln, and

bounded on the north by land belonging or reputed to belong to the Corporation as the local education authority, on the south by land belonging or reputed to belong to Coningsby Charles Sibthorp, on the east by other land belonging or reputed to belong to the said Frederic Thomas Tanqueray and occupied by Henry Twells, and on the west by the Lincoln and Honington branch line of the London and North Eastern Railway Company adjoining the existing Bracebridge Gasworks of the Corporation.

2. To make provision for the purchase by the Corporation of additional lands by agreement for the purposes of their gas undertaking and for the retention and disposal of lands and the application of the proceeds of sale of surplus lands.

3. To extend the limits of the Corporation for the supply of gas to the parishes of Saxilby with Ingleby, Burton (by Lincoln), Riseholme, Nettleham, Reepham, Willingham Cherry, and Greetwell, in the rural district of Welton, in the administrative county of the parts of Lindsey, and the parishes of Washingborough, Heighington Township, Branston, South Hykeham, and Thorpe-on-the-Hill, in the rural district of Branston, in the administrative county of the parts of Kesteven, and to empower the Corporation to charge a higher price for gas supplied by them in such added limits.

4. To make further and better provision for regulating the gas undertaking of the Corporation with regard to the use of anti-fluctuators with gas engines, the carrying out of works to internal piping or gas-consuming appliances or fittings reported to be dangerous, the supply of gas for premises having a separate supply of gas or a supply of electricity, steam or other form of energy, the mode of cutting off the supply of gas to any premises in consequence of any default on the part of the occupier, the payment of the expenses of re-connecting the discontinued supply of gas to any such premises, the freedom from distress or other legal process and the removal by the Corporation of meters, fittings, apparatus and appliances let for hire, the removal by the Corporation of pipes, meters and fittings or apparatus when supply of gas not required by new occupier, the specification of the minimum size and material of pipes and fittings, the laying and placing thereof and the placing of meters, the relief from obligation to supply and the provision of valves where high-pressure air or other gas is used.

5. To authorise the Corporation in connection with or for the purposes of their gas undertaking to acquire houses for their employees and buildings, offices and showrooms, or to erect the same upon any lands belonging to them, and to fit up showrooms and offices and exhibit specimen installations and give demonstrations.

6. To authorise the Corporation to contract for the purchase of gas in bulk.

7. To authorize the Corporation on application to supply gas to premises within the limits of supply outside the City which abut on private streets.

8. To authorize the Corporation to borrow money for the purposes of the Order and for any of the purposes of their gas undertaking, and to charge the monies so borrowed on the revenue of the gas undertaking and the general

rate and the general rate fund either jointly or separately, and to provide that monies so borrowed shall not be reckoned as part of the debt of the Corporation for the purposes of any enactment limiting their powers of borrowing and to apply certain financial provisions of the Lincoln Corporation (Water, &c.) Act, 1908, and the Lincoln Corporation Act, 1915, with any necessary modifications to the exercise of such borrowing powers.
