The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give
notice that the following Regulations are pub-
lished with the approval of the Lords Commis-
sioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR SITUATIONS IN THE JUNIOR GRADE OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE CLASS.

*Competitions under these regulations are open
both to men and women.*

*These regulations are liable to alteration from
time to time.*

1. Candidates must have attained the age
of 22 and must not have attained the age
of 24 on the first day of August in the year
in which the Examination is held.

In reckoning age for competition the follow-
ing allowances will be made, viz. :—

(a) Candidates who have served or are
serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force
may deduct from their actual age any time
during which they have so served.

(b) Candidates who have served in any
established civil situation to which they
were admitted with the Certificate of the
Civil Service Commissioners may deduct
from their actual age any time not exceeding
two years which they may have spent in
such service.

2. No person will be eligible who is not a
natural-born British subject and the child of
a father also a natural-born British subject;
provided that exception may be made in the
case of persons serving in a civil situation to
which they were admitted with the certificate
of the Civil Service Commissioners and pro-
vided that exception may be made as regards
the father in the case of Candidates who served
in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the
Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and
the 11th November, 1918.

3. No person actually serving in the Army,
Navy, or Air Force will be eligible for admis-
sion to the Examination unless he produces
to the Civil Service Commissioners, when
called upon to do so, the permission of his
Commanding Officer to attend the Examina-
