

of Special Anthropology (46), and Agriculture (47), other equivalent training will be required. There will be no laboratory test as part of the examination.

9. From the marks assigned to Candidates in each subject such deduction will be made as the Civil Service Commissioners may deem necessary in order to secure that no credit be allowed for merely superficial knowledge.

10. Moreover, Candidates whose handwriting is not easily legible will suffer a further deduction of marks on that account.

11. Application for permission to attend one of these Examinations must be made in the writing of the Candidate, at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Commissioners.

12. A fee of £8 will be required from every Candidate attending an examination.

13. Out of the list resulting from each Examination will be filled (provided there be Candidates duly qualified):—

(a) All the vacancies in the Junior Grade of the Administrative Class which may have been reported to the Civil Service Commissioners up to the date of the announcement of the result of the Examination;

(b) Any additional vacancies occurring within six months from the date of the announcement of the result of the Examination, which the Head of the Department may desire to have so filled.

The assignment by the Civil Service Commissioners of successful Candidates will be made with due regard to the requirements of the situation to be filled. Subject to this condition, Candidates will be allowed to choose, according to their place on the list, among the vacancies (a) for which they are duly qualified; or they may elect to wait for the chance of a vacancy (b). When vacancies (b) occur, they will be offered in rotation to the qualified Candidates then on the list, who will be free to decline them without forfeiting their claim to subsequent vacancies (b).

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held in London in 1928, under the foregoing Regulations. The viva voce test (Subject 6) will be held in July and each candidate will in due course be informed when he is to appear. The question papers for some written tests of Section B subjects will probably be set in the week beginning Sunday, 22nd July. The examination in Section A subjects which are taken by all candidates will begin on the 1st August.

Work No. 49—

A line or lines of pipes commencing in the parish of St. Bride's Minor in the rural district of Penybont and terminating in the parish of Coity Higher in the rural district of Penybont in the service reservoir (Work No. 50) next described.

Work No. 50—

A service reservoir in the parish of Coity Higher.

Work No. 51—

A line or lines of pipes commencing in the parish of Coity Higher in the service reservoir (Work No. 50) before described and terminating in the parish of Pencoed in the rural district of Penybont.
