ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 27TH FEBRUARY, 1928.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 31) shall be read and have effect as if the parish of Llangynwyd Higher in the County of Glamorgan, were included in and formed part of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant and convey to the Incumbent of the Vicarage of Barrington, in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same Vicarage, all and singular, the yearly tithe commutation rentcharges particularly described in the Schedule hereunto annexed, and now vested in us: To have and to hold the said yearly tithe commutation rentcharges to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever.

Provided always, that the Incumbent for the time being of the same Vicarage shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the rents, profits, and proceeds of the said yearly tithe commutation rentcharges for and in respect of the period intervening between the first day of April in the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven and the date of the publication of these Presents in the London Gazette.
