ROADS ACT, 1920.

COUNTY OF THE WEST RIDING OF YORKSHIRE.

Notice is hereby given that on the 28th day of February, 1928, the Minister of Transport made an Order under Section 7 (4) of the Roads Act, 1920, in respect of certain highways in the County of the West Riding of Yorkshire, to the following effect:—

During the period of five years from the 19th March, 1928, no person shall drive or cause to be driven on the highways specified in the First Schedule any locomotive, any heavy motor car or any motor car with seats for more than eight persons exclusive of the driver;

During the period of five years from the 19th March, 1928, no person shall drive or cause to be driven on the highways specified in the Second Schedule any locomotive, any heavy motor car or any motor car with seats for more than fourteen persons exclusive of the driver;

During the period of five years from the 19th March, 1928, no person shall drive or cause to be driven on the highways specified in the Third Schedule any mechanicallypropelled vehicle which has an unladen weight exceeding 3 tons or which has seats for more than twenty persons exclusive of the driver.

Nothing in the Order contained shall prevent the driving on the said roads of :---

(i) Any vehicle which is being used for the purposes of agriculture in connection with land adjoining or lying near to the said roads or for the conveyance or haulage of timber felled upon such land;

(ii) Any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any house, building or other premises situate on or adjacent to the said roads;

(iii) Any vehicle which is being used in connection with the maintenance, improve-
