TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 19th March, 1928, to Saturday, the 24th March, 1928, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for

the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACTS,
1920 to 1926.

REFERENCES TO THE HIGH COURT OF JUSTICE UNDER SECTION 10 (1) OF THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT, 1920.

Pursuant to paragraph 6 of the Unemployment Insurance (Determination of Questions) Regulations, 1920, the Minister of Labour hereby gives notice of his intention to refer to the High Court for decision the following question that has arisen in applications made to him for his decision under Section 10 of the

Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, namely, whether the employment of persons in the following circumstances is, or is not, employment within the meaning of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920:—

Employment as a domestic servant by the proprietor and for the purposes of a hostel for students attending a High School for Girls which is primarily a day school.

Pupils and students, however, attending the High School may be received in recognised boarding houses or hostels the proprietors of which comply with certain regulations of the School Authorities.

The proprietor of such a boarding house or hostel is financially independent of the school and may or may not be a member of the teaching staff of the school.

Under the Rules of the Supreme Court Order LV.B, Rule 28, any person who claims to be affected by the decisions to be given in the above mentioned cases may apply to the Judge for leave to intervene.

The cases have been set down in the High Court and will be heard in the near future.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF NON-ESTABLISHED DRAUGHTSMAN IN THE SURVEY SECTION OF THE TITHE BRANCH OF THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 18 and 25; candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the examination. A candidate who attained the age of 18 on the first day of the examination would be admitted, but a candidate who attained the age of 25 on that day would not be admitted.

The following exceptions to the above age limits are allowed :—

(i) Persons who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

(ii) Persons who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and the children of fathers also natural-born British subjects; provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and provided that exception may be made as regards the father in the case of candidates who have served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

3. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

4. Female candidates must be unmarried or widows and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

The successful candidates will be appointed in a non-established capacity, subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners that they are eligible in respect of age, nationality, health and character; they will be eligible for subsequent appointment to the established grade of Draughtsman as vacancies occur therein, a further fee of 10s. being the balance of the prescribed fee of £1 being payable on establishment.

ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND AND ISLE OF MAN) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 3).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Revocation of Existing Orders.

1. The Animals (Landing from Ireland and Isle of Man) Order of 1928 and the Animals (Landing from Ireland and Isle of Man) Order of 1928 (No. 2) and any Orders amending those Orders are hereby revoked.

Regulation of Landing.

2. Cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shipped from Ireland or the Isle of Man shall not, unless and until it is otherwise ordered by the Minister, be landed at any port or place in Great Britain except in accordance with the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland, Channel Islands, and Isle of Man) Order of 1923, as amended by any subsequent Order and this Order.

Ports in Ireland from which animals may not be shipped.

3. The landing in Great Britain of any cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from either of the ports of Rosslare or Wexford is hereby prohibited.

Movement from Landing Place of Animals intended for immediate slaughter.

4. Cattle, sheep, goats or swine landed as from the commencement of this Order and intended for immediate slaughter shall not be moved from the landing place unless they are accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry and subject to the following conditions:—

(i) The animals shall be moved to the place of detention specified in the licence and not elsewhere and shall be there detained and slaughtered within a period of ten days after the date of their arrival thereat. Whilst so detained animals moved with a licence under this Article shall be kept separate as far as practicable from any other animals.

(ii) Animals moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route, and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with animals not being moved under this Article.

Movement from Landing Place of Animals not intended for immediate slaughter.

5. Cattle, sheep, goats or swine landed as from the commencement of this Order and not intended for immediate slaughter shall not be moved from the landing place unless

they are accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry and subject to the following conditions:—

(i) The animals shall be moved to the place of detention specified in the licence and not elsewhere and shall be there detained and isolated from other animals for a period of fourteen days after the date of their arrival thereat unless previously slaughtered thereon.

(ii) Animals moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with animals not being moved under this Article.

Conditions of Landing at any Landing Place.

6. The landing of any animals under this Order must be authorised by the Superintendent or person in charge of the Landing Place.

Offences.

7. Any person committing, or aiding, abetting, counselling or procuring the commission of any breach of the provisions of this Order, is liable, on summary conviction, to the penalties provided by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Commencement.

9. This Order shall come into operation on the sixteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Short Title.

10. This Order may be cited as the ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND AND ISLE OF MAN) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 3).
