2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 19th March, 1928, to Saturday. the 24th March, 1928, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
