Civil Service Commission, March 9, 1928.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF NON-ESTABLISHED DRAUGHTSMAN IN THE SURVEY SECTION OF THE TITHE BRANCH OF THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 18 and 25; candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the examination. A candidate who attained the age of 18 on the first day of the examination would be admitted, but a candidate who attained the age of 25 on that day would not be admitted.

The following exceptions to the above age limits are allowed :---

(i) Persons who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

(ii) Persons who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

"2. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and the children of fathers also natural-born British subjects; provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and provided that exception may be made as regards the father in the case of candidates who have served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the Great War between the 4th August, 1914. and the 11th November, 1918.

3. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

4. Female candidates must be unmarried or widows and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

5. The examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—

Candidates must pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in Drawing and in the aggregate of the marks obtained.

6. Application for permission to attend an examination must be made in the writing of the candidate, at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

7. A fee of 10s. will be required from each candidate attending an examination.

8. The successful candidates will be appointed in a non-established capacity, subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners that they are eligible in respect of age, nationality, health and character; they will be eligible for subsequent appointment to the established grade of Draughtsman as vacancies occur therein, a further fee of 10s. being the balance of the prescribed fee of £1 being payable on establishment.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACT, 1925.

By an Order dated 24th February, 1928, the Minister of Health has consented (1) to the adoption of Sections 54 and 55, contained in Part V (watercourses &c.) of the above Act by the Council of the Borough of Wareham (2) to the adoption of Section 21 (prevention of water flowing on footpath), Section 22 (preventing soil &c., from being washed into streets) and Sections 51 to 55, contained in Part V (watercourses &c.), of the above Act by the Urban District Council of Llantarnam and (3) to the adoption of the said Sections contained in Part V of the Act by the Urban District Council of Hazel Grove and Bramhall.

MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT.

IN THE MATTER OF THE LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Minister of Transport after the expiration of at least forty days from this date in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Section 7 of the aforesaid London Traffic Act to make regulations amending the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations.

And notice is hereby further given that on account of urgency the Minister of Transport has under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) General Amendment (No. 3) Provisional Regulations, 1928, to come into operation forthwith as provisional regulations to continue in force until regulations have been made in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of that Act.

These regulations are consequent upon a change in ownership of certain omnibuses.
