

of Wallasey in the Birkenhead Union shall be extended to include part of the Civil Parish of Bidston cum Ford in the same union and the Civil Parish of Moreton now in the Wirral Union.

And whereas it is expedient that certain consequential alterations should be made in the constitution of the registration sub-districts hereinafter mentioned:—

Now, therefore, I, Sylvanus Percival Vivian, C.B., Registrar General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Births and Deaths Registration Acts, 1836 to 1926, and with the sanction of the Minister of Health, do hereby order as follows:—

(1) This Order may be cited as the Birkenhead and Wirral Registration of Births, etc. (Alteration of Sub-districts), Order, 1928, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1928.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it

applies to the Interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(3) The Civil Parish of Moreton shall cease to form part of the Woodchurch sub-district of the Wirral Registration District and shall be added to and form part of the Wallasey sub-district of the Birkenhead Registration District.

(4) The Superintendent Registrar of the existing Birkenhead Registration District shall be the Superintendent Registrar of that District as extended by this Order.

(5) The Registrar of the existing Wallasey sub-district of the Birkenhead Registration District shall be the Registrar of that sub-district as extended by this Order.
