The streets and parts of streets in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a specified time are as follows:—

In the Parish of Ifield:—

Watling Street from Northfleet Urban District Boundary 100 yards in an easterly direction.
Whitehill Lane from the Gravesend Boundary to the Cobham Boundary.

In the Parish of Cobham:—

Whitehill Lane to the Gravesend Borough Sanatorium.

To incorporate with or without amendment all or some of the provisions of the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 and to repeal alter or amend so much of the Gravesend Electric Lighting Order 1898 as extended by the Gravesend (Extension to Northfleet) Order 1905 as may be necessary to give effect to the purposes of the Order.

To authorise the Corporation in the event of their obtaining the consent of the Minister of Transport under Sub-section (1) of Section 5 of the Electric Lighting Act 1909 to the supply by them within their area of supply (including the added areas) of electricity for the purposes of haulage or traction on any railway, tramway or canal situate partly within and partly without that area or for the purposes of lighting vehicles and vessels used on any such railway tramway or canal, to supply electricity to be used for purposes incidental to the working or lighting of such railways, tramways and canals other than the purposes aforesaid.

To confer upon the Corporation all or some of the powers contained in the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1926 and the enactments incorporated therewith and to alter vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which will or may interfere with any of the objects of the Order and to confer other rights and privileges.

And notice is hereby given that the draft of the Order has been deposited at the offices of the Electricity Commissioners and printed copies of the draft Order as applied for and of the Order when made may be obtained (at the price of two shillings for each copy) at the offices of the undermentioned Town Clerk and of Mr. A. WIMBORNE & DISTRICT ELECTRICITY (EXTENSION).

THE Bournemouth & Poole Electric Supply Company Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") whose registered office is situate at County House, 46/47, New Broad Street in the City of London have applied to the Electricity Commissioners under the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1926 for a Special Order for the following purposes:—

1. To extend their area of supply so as to authorise them to supply electricity for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1926 in the Borough of Wareham; the Parishes of Affpuddle, Turners Puddle, Bere Regis, Bloxworth, Morden, East Stoke, East Holme, Wareham St. Martin, Arne, Corfe Castle, Tyneham, Steeple, Church Knowle, Kimmeridge and Worth Matravers in the Rural District of Wareham and Purbeck; the Parish of Lytchett Matravers in the Rural District of Poole; the Parishes of Almer, Shapwick, Sturminster Marshall, Witchampton, Hinton Martell, Hinton Parva, Holt, More Crichele, Chalbury, Horton, Woodlands, Verwood, Long Crichele, Gussage St. Michael, Gussage All Saints, Wimborne St. Giles, Edmondsham, Alderholt, Handley, Pentridge, East Wood-yates, West Woodyates, and Cranborne in the Rural District of Wimborne and Cranborne; and the Rural District of Blandford except such parts of the parishes of Blandford St. Mary, Bryanston, Langton, Long Blandford and Pimperne as lie within a radius of one and a quarter miles of a circle drawn with the Blandford Forum and District Electric Supply Company's generating station at Blandford as a centre.

2. To authorise the Company to exercise within the area of supply the powers usually conferred on distributors of electrical energy.

3. The names of the streets and parts of streets in which electrical lines are to be laid down within a specified time are as follows:—

In the Borough of Wareham:—

North Street,
South Street,
East Street,
West Street.

4. The streets and parts of streets not repairable by the Local Authorities and the railways and tramways which the Company propose to take special powers by the Order to break up are as follows:—
