The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 20th day of March, 1928 (N. 2807/27), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Section 6 of the Royal Naval Reserve Volunteer Act, 1859, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the Volunteers under that Act shall for such time as they shall be in actual service thereunder be entitled when on shore or afloat to the pay and other advantages of Petty Officers or Seamen in the Royal Navy according to the ratings which they may be found qualified to fill:

“And whereas we consider that Seamen Petty Officers of the Royal Naval Reserve belonging to the Patrol Service should when called into actual service under the said Act be known and rank as Second Hands:

“And whereas for this purpose it is necessary to establish in Your Majesty's Royal Navy a rating to be known as Second Hand and to provide for the counting of certain mobilised service for progressive increases of pay:

“We beg humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may, by Your Order in Council, be graciously pleased

“(1) To sanction the establishment in Your Majesty's Royal Navy of the rating of Second Hand who shall when borne for service in any commissioned trawler, drifter or other small vessel, rank immediately before any Petty Officer borne for service in the same or a similar vessel but save as aforesaid shall rank with Seamen Petty Officers of the Royal Navy.

“(2) To authorize the payment to persons holding the rating of Second Hand of pay and allowances at the same rates as

are from time to time in force for Seamen Petty Officers, mobilised service as Second Hand in the former trawler section of the Royal Naval Reserve or as Seaman Petty Officer in the Royal Naval Reserve counting for progressive increases of pay as though it were mobilised service as a Second Hand.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme with respect to the Archdeaconries and Rural Deaneries within the Diocese of Blackburn:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Percy

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Percy Mark, Bishop of the said Diocese of Blackburn (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the said Archdeaconry of Blackburn and the said Archdeaconry of Lancaster respectively shall comprise and consist of the Rural Deaneries, the names of which are set down in numbered order under the name of each of the said two Archdeaconries respectively in the said Schedule to this Scheme annexed, and that the name which in such Schedule is given to any Rural Deanery shall be the name thereof, and that every Parish or Cure or Church, the name of which is set down in numbered order in the first column of the said Schedule under the name of the said Archdeaconry of Blackburn or under the name of the said Archdeaconry of Lancaster and under the name of any Rural Deanery in either of the said two Archdeaconries respectively, shall belong to and be and form a part of the Archdeaconry and of the Rural Deanery under the respective names of which it appears as aforesaid and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Archdeacon of such Archdeaconry and of the Rural Dean of such Rural Deanery respectively and shall not belong to or be or form a part of any other Archdeaconry or Rural Deanery nor be subject to the jurisdiction or authority of any other Archdeacon or Rural Dean.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, under or by virtue of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

The following Statute made by the Master and Scholars of Balliol College in the University of Oxford, on the 18th day of March, 1928, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

STATUTE to amend the existing Statutes of Balliol College in the University of Oxford duly made at a General Meeting of the Master and Scholars especially summoned for that purpose on the Fourteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and passed at such meeting by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

STATUTE for Balliol College made by the College under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923.

PRELIMINARY.

This Statute is supplementary to the existing Statutes of the College that is to say the Statutes dated the 19th day of December, 1925, made for the College by the University of Oxford Commissioners.

III.—THE FELLOWS.

Clause 10 is hereby repealed and in its stead the following is hereby enacted:—

"An Official Fellowship shall be tenable for seven years from the day of election, or for such shorter period as the College may at the time of election determine, and the holder thereof shall be re-eligible for further periods, not exceeding in each case seven years; provided that no person shall hold an Official Fellowship after he has attained the age of sixty-five years."

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Merton College, in the University of Oxford, on the 19th day of March, 1928, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

WE, the Warden and Fellows of Merton College, Oxford, respectfully submit to His Majesty the King in Council the following new Statute which was made by the College and passed on Monday, March 19, 1928, at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the College specially summoned for the purpose by the votes of more than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, in accordance with the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, Section 7 (2).

New Sub-section to be added to Section 2 of Statute XIV.

"(f) The Governing Body may, if they think fit, grant to Mr. Douglas Theodore Thring, on his ceasing to hold the office of Estates' Bursar, a pension chargeable on the Pension Fund, the yearly amount of which shall be at the rate of £25 for each completed year during which he shall have held the office of Estates' Bursar, but so that no such pension shall exceed £400 a year."

The following Address was presented to The KING on the occasion of the opening by His Majesty of Lloyd's new building in Leadenhall Street, London, E.C., on the 24th March, 1928:—

CORPORATION OF LLOYD'S.

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY,
May it please Your Majesty,

The great building, the foundation stone of which was laid by Your Majesty nearly three years ago, is now completed, and it is with the deepest gratitude that the Members of Lloyd's on the first occasion of meeting in their new home are privileged to have the high honour of Your Majesty's presence and that of Her Majesty The Queen.

The ceremony to-day recalls the opening of the present Royal Exchange, when the illustrious Queen Victoria, accompanied by His Royal Highness The Prince Consort, performed the opening ceremony at the head of a distinguished company in Lloyd's Room.

It is not without feelings of regret that Lloyd's relinquishes its old home in that historic building after a tenancy of more than a century and a half, interrupted only by the period of rebuilding after the fire of 1838. But the whole area of Your Majesty's Capital City abounds with historic associations, and East India House, on the site of which we now stand, possesses memories not less inspiring than those which belong to the Royal Exchange.

The origin and growth of Lloyd's constitute a strange and romantic story, by which the

name of a humble coffee-man of the 17th century has been adopted by Lines of steamers in many seas and has become a household word in many lands. It has been a long evolutionary process during which vital changes have been made, gradually and often without deliberate intent. From the custom of a few men meeting fortuitously at a Coffee House there has evolved the Corporation of Lloyd's with its world-wide influence, needing for its home the great building which Your Majesty graciously opens to-day.

Behind the material development thus manifested lie those qualities of energy and character which have built up the reputation of Lloyd's, and upon the maintenance of which all else depends. Your Majesty's gracious act in coming amongst us to-day and the presence of Her Majesty the Queen will inspire us all to the resolve that the Lloyd's of the future shall be worthy of those men of character and ability, the result of whose labours we inherit.

Heirs as we are of this great Lloyd's tradition, it is natural for us to think first with pride and gratitude of the high honour that Your Majesty's presence confers on Lloyd's itself. But we are conscious, too, that in thus honouring Lloyd's, Your Majesty is honouring the business of insurance, which in so many ways touches and influences the lives of Your Majesty's subjects. For, wherever Insurance operates, whatever form it takes, it embodies the same beneficent principle—that the strong and the weak, the fortunate and the unfortunate, share their burdens, and by sharing lighten them.

In the sphere of Trade, Marine Insurance, by making possible the exchange of goods overseas, strengthens the bonds between nation and nation, makes for International peace, and is one of many connecting links between distant parts of Your Majesty's Empire.

And as in Foreign Trade Insurance is an International bond, so among Your Majesty's subjects at home it is a great social bond. It gives occasion for the exercise of thrift, mitigates for thousands the fear of an unknown future, and relieves, as nothing else can, the burden of those, who through misfortune, fall out of the race of life.

Speaking when Lloyd's had been but a year in the old Royal Exchange, Edmund Burke used words which may encourage us to-day: "If we are conscious of our station and glow with zeal to fill our places as becomes our situation and ourselves, we ought to elevate our minds to the greatness of that trust to which the Order of Providence has called us." It is in that spirit that we hope to be worthy of the high honour which Your Majesty has conferred upon us.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

I thank you very sincerely for your loyal and dutiful Address. It gives the Queen and myself great pleasure to come here to-day and to associate ourselves with the inauguration of this magnificent building, of which, three years ago, I laid the Foundation Stone.

The Corporation of Lloyd's are to be congratulated on this splendid addition to the

architecture of the City of London. The size and fine proportions of your new Hall, its dignity of style and skilful adaptation to the practical uses which it is intended to serve, will stamp it as a notable triumph of modern classical architecture. The builders of Roman London who, nearly twenty centuries ago, erected their Basilica on this site, would see in your Hall a lineal descendant worthy of the race.

Lloyd's is one of the greatest representatives of Insurance, especially of Marine Insurance, of which it was the pioneer: and it is the organised system of Marine Insurance which has transformed overseas trade from a daring and hazardous speculation to the orderly and smoothly working exchange of commodities on which modern civilisation depends. The hazards indeed remain, but their disastrous consequences have been averted by the introduction of Lloyd's Policies of Insurance, and the unerring justice in dealing with these Policies which has always been your proud tradition.

Your Address rightly alludes to the beneficent principle which underlies all Insurance, the sharing of one another's burdens. By the development of this ideal the community is linked together by mutual duties and service and in this way a shock, which would have overpowered the individual man, family or partnership, is so widely distributed that it can be harmlessly absorbed. It was a very wise man who, nearly three thousand years ago, said:—"Two are better than one . . . for if they fall the one will lift up the other: but woe to him that is alone when he falleth, for he hath not another to help him". And as Insurance creates a bond of union between citizen and citizen and between nation and nation, so it holds together the fabric of civilised society and is conducive to International Peace.

I congratulate the Corporation of Lloyd's upon the possession of this magnificent building. I know that in your new home will be preserved, unimpaired, your ancient traditions and, above all, the combination of business capacity with scrupulous integrity and liberality of mind which have long made Lloyd's an example of the highest type of British commerce.

May the Blessing of God be with the Corporation in all their activities, and the progress which we thankfully commemorate to-day be a stepping stone to still greater heights of honour and prosperity.

THE LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

SECTION 7.

QUARANTINE STATIONS (REGULATION)
ORDER OF 1928.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Approval by Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries of Premises as Quarantine Station for Animals intended for Export.

1.—(1) The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, hereinafter referred to as the Minister, may specially approve and authorise the use of any specified premises in Great Britain as a quarantine station for animals intended for export to a place of destination outside Great Britain in accordance with the provisions and for the purposes of this Order, and subject to such other conditions and rules as the Minister may prescribe; and it shall not be lawful to use any premises for the said purposes which have not been so approved and authorised.

(2) Premises approved and authorised for use as a quarantine station for the said purposes, hereinafter referred to as an approved quarantine station, shall not, whilst such approval is operative, be used for any other purpose.

(3) The Minister may at any time revoke any approval and authority given by him for the use of specified premises as a quarantine station for the purposes of this Order and thereupon the said premises shall cease to be an approved quarantine station.

Restriction of use of approved quarantine station to certain animals.

2. An animal shall not be moved into an approved quarantine station nor from an approved quarantine station to any vessel for shipment or elsewhere except with permission in writing granted by an Inspector or other Officer of the Ministry and subject to and in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

Application for admission of animals to an approved quarantine station to be in prescribed form.

3. Every application for permission to move an animal into an approved quarantine station shall be made on the forms and subject to the stipulations prescribed by or on behalf of the Minister.

Necessary Qualifications for Animals admitted into an Approved Quarantine Station.

4.—(1) Permission for the movement of an animal into an approved quarantine station shall not be granted except in respect of:—

(a) an animal which has been on premises in Great Britain situate outside a radius of at least 15 miles from any place on which cattle plague, foot-and-mouth disease, or pleuro-pneumonia, has been certified under the Diseases of Animals Acts and Orders of the Minister thereunder to exist during the period of three calendar months immediately preceding the date of the granting of the permission;

(b) an animal on premises in Great Britain on which all the animals have been examined, after the date of application for admission by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and certified by him to be free from cattle plague, foot-and-mouth disease, or pleuro-pneumonia; and

(c) an animal which is intended for movement from the quarantine station, after the expiry of the prescribed period of quarantine therein, direct to a vessel for

export in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

(2) An animal when being moved to an approved quarantine station with permission granted under this Order, shall be accompanied by a declaration signed by the owner of the animal at the time of the movement or by his authorised agent to the effect

(i) that to the best of his knowledge and belief the animal is free from any contagious or parasitic disease and that during the three months immediately preceding the movement the animal has not been exposed to infection; and

(ii) that the animal has been consigned to the quarantine station in a vehicle or vehicles which have been cleansed and disinfected in accordance with directions given by an Inspector of the Ministry.

Movement of animals from an Approved Quarantine Station to a vessel for Shipment.

5.—(1) Permission under this Order authorising the movement of an animal from an approved quarantine station to a vessel for shipment shall not be granted unless the animal has, during the prescribed period of quarantine in the quarantine station, which period shall be of not less than fourteen days duration, remained free from cattle plague, foot-and-mouth disease, or pleuro-pneumonia.

(2) An animal when being moved from an approved quarantine station to a vessel for shipment shall be accompanied by

(a) the written permission required under this Order;

(b) a certificate signed by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry to the effect that the animal was admitted to the Quarantine Station in accordance with the provisions of this Order, has been detained and isolated in the Quarantine Station under the supervision of a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry for a period of not less than fourteen days and has during that period remained free from cattle plague, foot-and-mouth disease and pleuro-pneumonia.

(3) Fodder or litter supplied for the use of the animals during the voyage shall be obtained in Great Britain under permission given by or on behalf of the Minister and only from districts certified to have been free from foot-and-mouth disease for a period of at least three calendar months immediately preceding the granting of such permission.

Restriction on Use of Fodder, Litter, etc. in an Approved Quarantine Station.

6. No fodder or litter shall be used for or about animals at an approved quarantine station or be moved into such station except with permission given by or on behalf of the Minister and such permission shall be given only in respect of fodder or litter obtained from districts in Great Britain certified to have been free from foot-and-mouth disease for a period of at least three calendar months immediately preceding the granting of such permission.

Restriction on Access of unauthorised persons to an Approved Quarantine Station.

7. No person shall enter an approved quarantine station except with permission in

writing given by or on behalf of the Minister. Any such permission shall contain any conditions as to personal disinfection or otherwise which the Minister may deem necessary to prevent the introduction or spread of contagious diseases of animals.

Offences.

8. Any person committing, or aiding, abetting, counselling or procuring the commission of any breach of the provisions of this Order or of any rules made hereunder shall be liable, on summary conviction, to the penalties provided by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

9. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Interpretation.

10. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires:—

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats and swine;

“Inspector” includes Veterinary Inspector;

“Person” includes a body corporate;

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Short Title.

12. This Order may be cited as QUARANTINE STATIONS (REGULATION) ORDER OF 1928.

The petty sessional division of Bedwellty (except the parishes of Abercarn, Mynyddislwyn and Bedwas); and the parish of Blaenavon.
