are from time to time in force for Seamen Petty Officers, mobilised service as Second Hand in the former trawler section of the Royal Naval Reserve or as Seaman Fetty Officer in the Royal Naval Reserve counting for progressive increases of pay as though it were mobilised service as a Second Hand.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their con-

currence in these proposals.

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 15th day of March, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 3rth and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme with respect to the Archdeaconries and Rural Deaneries

within the Diocese of Blackburn:

"Whereas there are within the said Diocese of Blackburn two Archdeaconries, to wit, the Archdeaconry of Blackburn and the Archdeaconry of Lancaster:

'And whereas the Right Reverend Percy

Mark, Bishop of the said Diocese of Blackburn, has represented to us that it is desirable to make certain new arrangements (being the arrangements hereinafter recommended and proposed) with respect to the Rural Deaneries within the said Archdeaconries of Blackburn and Lancaster:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the new arrangements now proposed by the said Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn, may pro-

perly be carried into effect:

Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Percy Mark, Bishop of the said Diocese of Blackburn (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the said Archdeaconry of Blackburn and the said Archdeaconry of Lancaster respectively shall comprise and consist of the Rural Deaneries, the names of which are set down in numbered order under the name of each of the said two Archdeaconries respectively in the said Schedule to this Scheme annexed, and that the name which in such Schedule is given to any Rural Deanery shall be the name thereof, and that every Parish or Cure or Church, the name of which is set down in numbered order in the first column of the said Schedule under the name of the said Archdeaconry of Blackburn or under the name of the said Archdeaconry of Lancaster and under the name of any Rural Deanery in either of the said two Arch-deaconries respectively, shall belong to and be and form a part of the Archdeaconry and of the Rural Deanery under the respective names of which it appears as aforesaid and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Archdeacon of such Archdeaconry and of the Rural Dean of such Rural Deanery respectively and shall not belong to or be or form a part of any other Archdeaconry or Rural Deanery nor be subject to the jurisdiction or authority of any other Archdeacon or Rural Dean.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, under or by virtue of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"I. The Archdeaconry of Blackburn, comprising the following Rural Deaneries:—
