The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of eighteen and young persons of sixteen years of age and over in the Cheese Department at

the works of the Dominion Dairy Company Limited, Bicester Road, Aylesbury, Bucks, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable protective clothing, cloakroom and messroom accommodation shall be provided; that arrangements shall be made for the supervision of the workers by a responsible forewoman and that the Secretary of State may at any time require the occupiers to make such special arrangements for the conveyance of workers living at a distance or otherwise for the welfare of such workers as may be necessary to prevent hardship.

Front of vehicles toward the West. <i>Second Portion.</i> —Five carriages by the kerb on the West side of Severus Road, commencing opposite No. 4, Severus Road, and extending Southward as far as necessary. Front of vehicles toward the North. The first portion of the Standing to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion.

Six Hackney Carriages: In centre of roadway, commencing at a point immediately in line with the Guard Post situated on the kerb by the South end of No. 12, Waterloo Place, and extending Southward as far as necessary for six carriages, keeping to the West side of the Sandbin and Lamp Standard situated immediately North of the Guards' Memorial. Front of vehicles toward the North.
