FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 50).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power

enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Further Contraction of Selston (Notts.) Footand-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 47) as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 48), shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the First Schedule to the last-mentioned Order.
