**CHEADLE AND DISTRICT ELECTRICITY
[SPECIAL ORDER].**

(The Supply of Electricity by Power Development Company Limited within parts of the Rural Districts of Cheadle and Stone in the County of Stafford; the Laying Down and Erection of Lines Wires Posts and Apparatus; the Taking and Recovery of Rates and Charges; Incorporation of Acts and other Provisions.)

NOTICE is hereby given that the Power Development Company Limited whose registered office is at 25, Victoria Street, in the City of Westminster, are applying to the Electricity Commissioners for a Special Order (hereinafter called "the Order") under the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1926 for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorise the said Power Development Company or a Company to be registered under the Companies Acts 1908 to 1917 (each of whom is hereinafter referred to as "the Undertakers") to supply and distribute electricity for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electric Lighting Acts within the Parishes or Townships of Alton alias Alveton, Bradley-in-the-Moors, Caverswall, Cheadle, Checkley and Tean, Dilhorne, Draycott-in-the-Moors, Forsbrook, Kingsley and Whiston, and Oakmoor in the Rural District of Cheadle and so much of the Parish of Ipstones in the said Rural District as lies to the south of a line drawn from the point of intersection of the footpath from Shirley to Newfields and the boundary of the said parish to the point where the said boundary crosses the London Midland and Scottish Railway 450 feet or thereabouts north west of the west end of the footbridge over the River Churnet and the Parish of Fulford in the Rural District of Stone all in the County of Stafford (hereinafter referred to as "the area of supply").

2. To incorporate with the Order such of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 as are applicable to cases in which the undertakers are not the local authority and to apply such provisions to the undertaking to be authorised by the Order subject to such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein.

3. To authorise the Undertakers to open and break up streets and parts of streets in the area of supply which are not repairable by the local authority and railways.

4. To provide for the laying down of electric lines in certain streets and parts of streets in the area of supply within a period to be specified in the Order.

5. To prescribe and limit the prices to be charged for a supply of electrical energy.

6. To confer upon the Undertakers with or without variations all or some of the powers of the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1926 and enactments incorporated therewith and to alter vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.

7. To vary and extend the provisions of Section 21 of the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1889 with respect to

the period prescribed for the laying down of mains for the purposes of general supply in some or all of the districts forming the area of supply and to define the terms upon which and the times within which such supply is to be given.

8. To make provision for the transfer of the undertaking proposed to be authorised by the Order to a Company to be registered under the Companies Acts 1908 to 1917.

And notice is hereby also given that the draft of the Order has been deposited at the office of the Electricity Commissioners and printed copies of the draft Order as applied for and of the Order when made may be obtained (at the price of two shillings for each copy) from A. E. Foster, Esq., Church Parade, Cheadle, and at the offices of the under-mentioned Parliamentary Agents.

Copies of the draft Order and of the Maps showing the proposed area of supply and the streets within which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a specified time have been deposited for public inspection at the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Stafford at Stafford and at the offices of the respective Clerks to the Cheadle and Stone Rural District Councils at Cheadle and Stone respectively.

And notice is hereby further given that every local or other public authority company or person desirous of bringing before the Electricity Commissioners any objection respecting the application must do so by registered letter addressed to the Secretary, Electricity Commission, Savoy Court, Strand, W.C. 2, posted on or before the 30th day of July, 1928, and a copy of such objections must also be forwarded to the undersigned Parliamentary Agents.

**BOSTON AND DISTRICT ELECTRICITY
(SKEGNESS &c. EXTENSION).**

THE Boston and District Electric Supply Company Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Company"), whose registered office is situate at 62 and 63, Queen Street, in the City of London, have applied to the Electricity Commissioners under the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1926 for a Special Order for the following objects:—

(a) To authorise the Company to generate, transform and distribute electrical energy for all public and private purposes as defined by the above Acts within the urban district of Skegness, the parishes of Burgh-le-Marsh, Croft, Friskney, Ingoldmells, Wainfleet All Saints, and Wainfleet St. Mary, in the rural district of Spilsby, and the portion of the parish of Addlethorpe, in the same rural district, which was added thereto by the Lindsey (Skegness Urban District) Confirmation Order 1926 (hereinafter referred to as "the added area").

(b) To extend to the added area certain of the provisions of the Boston and District
