The following Statutes made by the University of Oxford, on the 19th day of June, 1928, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON TUESDAY, JUNE 19, 1928.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend § 22 of Titulus XIX of the Statutes of the University of Oxford so as to alter the date by which Colleges are required in every year to send Abstracts of Income and Expenditure to the Registrar of the University from the twenty-fourth day of March to the first day of May. and to make a consequential alteration in § 18 of the same Titulus: NOW THE SAID UNIVERSITY in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, ENACTS, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, AS FOLLOWS.

1. In Statt. Tit. XIX. § 18. cl. 8 (Statuta, ed. 1927, p. 331) the words "within three months" shall be struck out and the following words shall be substituted: "on or before the twenty-fourth day of June next."

2. Ibid. § 22. cl. 1 (p. 345), the words "the twenty-fourth day of March" shall be struck out and the words the "first day of May" shall be substituted.

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON TUESDAY, JUNE 19, 1928.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend § 2 of Sect. 1 of Titulus VII of the Statutes of the University of Oxford, so as to provide that the Vinerian Scholarship shall be awarded on the papers set in the Examination for the Degree of Bachelor of Civil Law, and shall be open to all candidates for that Examination who are qualified to obtain Honours: NOW THE SAID UNIVERSITY in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, ENACTS, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, AS FOLLOWS.

In Statt. Tit. VII. Sect. 1. § 2 (Statuta, ed. 1927, p. 159), cl. 3 and cl. 4 shall be struck out and the following new clauses shall be substituted:—

"3. One Scholarship shall be offered for competition in the Trinity Term of each year, and shall be open to any member of the University who is qualified to obtain Honours in the Examination for the Degree of Bachelor of Civil Law held in that Term.
