MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

SECTION 9.

COUNTY OF KENT.

URBAN DISTRICT OF BECKENHAM.

· To the County Council of Kent;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour.

And whereas by sub-section (3) of the said Section the Local Government Board were empowered to revoke or alter any Regulation made by them under the said Section.

The subscriber (or failing him, his telephone station) will be notified of the impracticability of completing the call. When a "person-to-person" call matures, no "report charge" will be made.
