WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 10th day of May, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting

the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Torbryan and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Ipplepen and for effecting certain alterations of boundaries affecting the Parishes of the said Benefices of Torbryan and Ipplepen and the Parishes of the Benefices of Bickington, Highweek, Denbury, Woodland, Broadhempston and Marldon, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Exeter, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Torbryan and Ipplepen and certain alterations of boundaries affecting the Parishes of those Benefices and of the said Benefices of Bickington and Highweek duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Exeter and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices of Torbryan and Ipplepen and the terms for effecting the union (including certain alterations of the boundaries of the Parishes of all the Benefices hereinbefore mentioned), and the said Bishop of Exeter signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices of Torbryan and Ipplepen and for the alterations of boundaries so recommended as aforesaid based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

" And whereas the said Benefice of Ipplepen is now full, the Reverend Robert Duins Cooke being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Torbryan is at present vacant:

" And whereas the said Robert Duins Cooke has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

" And whereas there is a pension of £110 per annum payable out of the revenues of the said Benefice of Torbryan to the Reverend John Charles Dunn, late Incumbent thereof:

" And whereas the said Benefice of Woodland is at present vacant:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Torbryan and the said Benefice of Ipplepen shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Ipplepen with Torbryan' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Ipplepen, but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Robert Duins Cooke if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ipplepen shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Ipplepen shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Torbryan and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the §2nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the Patron of the said Benefice of Torbryan shall have the first turn of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union, and the second and all succeeding turns of presentation or nomination to the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Ipplepen.

" 5. That with the consent of the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of

Your Majesty, as Patron of the said Benefice of Broadhempston (testified by his signing this Scheme), with the consent of the said William, Bishop of Exeter, as the Patron of the said Benefice of Marlton (testified as aforesaid), with the consents of the Most Noble Henry Pelham Archibald Douglas, Duke of Newcastle, Sir Robert Hunt Stapylton Dudley Lydston Newman, Baronet, M.P., Sir Ambrose Elton of Clevedon Court, Somerset, Baronet, Charles Wilfrid Boodle, of Elvedon, Esher, Surrey, Esquire, and Basil Walter Cuthbert Leefe, of Woodlands, Barnes Common, Surrey, Esquire, as the Patrons of the said Benefice of Denbury (testified by their signing this Scheme), and with the consent of the Parochial Church Council of the said Benefice and Parish of Woodland as the Patrons of such Benefice of Woodland (testified by a resolution of the said Parochial Church Council dated the 12th day of August, 1927, and duly communicated to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England), and with the consents also of the Reverend Arthur Robert Hutchison, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bickington, of the Reverend Thomas Collins Walters, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Highweek, of the Reverend John Arthur Nash, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Denbury, of the Reverend Henry Richard Evans, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Broadhempston and of the Reverend Reginald Francis Holiocke Trevaldwyne, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Marlton (all of which consents are testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), the portions of Parishes described in the 1st column of the Schedule hereto annexed (all which portions are delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and thereon coloured respectively as stated in the 2nd column of the said Schedule) shall as from the date of the said union taking effect be severed from the Parishes of the Benefices of which they now form part and shall for all ecclesiastical purposes be annexed respectively to the Parishes stated in the 3rd column of the said Schedule, and the Tithe Rent Charges arising within each such portion the amount of which is stated in the 4th column of the said Schedule and all capital sums of money stocks and other securities being or representing the proceeds of the redemption of any part or parts of such tithe rent charges shall as from the date mentioned in each case in the 5th column of the said Schedule cease to form part of the endowment of the Benefice from which such portion shall have been severed as aforesaid and shall become part of the endowment of the Benefice to which such portion is hereby recommended and proposed to be transferred: provided that the said pension of £110 per annum payable to the said John Charles Dunn shall upon the union taking effect become and be payable wholly by the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Ipplepen with Torbryan.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Exeter has been duly given in

the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Luke the Evangelist, Newcastle upon Tyne, and of the District of Saint James and Saint Basil, Fenham, both in the County of Northumberland and in the Diocese of Newcastle:

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 28th day of October, 1892, and published in the London Gazette on the 4th day of the following month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Luke the Evangelist, situate within the Parish or Parochial Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Newcastle upon Tyne, in the said County of Northumberland and in the said Diocese of Newcastle, and the said District Chapelry was named ‘ The District Chapelry of Saint Luke the Evangelist, Newcastle upon Tyne ’:

“ And whereas the said District Chapelry of Saint Luke the Evangelist, Newcastle upon Tyne, has under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“ And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 5th day of November, 1926, and published in the London Gazette on the 9th day of the same month, certain portions of the said New Parish of Saint Luke the Evangelist, Newcastle upon Tyne, of the New Parish of Saint James, Benwell, and of the New Parish of Saint Augustine, Newcastle upon Tyne, both in the said County of Northumberland and in

the said Diocese of Newcastle; were constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and the said District was named ‘ The District of Saint James and Saint Basil, Fenham ’:

“ And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Luke the Evangelist, Newcastle upon Tyne, and of the said District of Saint James and Saint Basil, Fenham, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Harold Ernest, Bishop of Newcastle (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Luke the Evangelist, Newcastle upon Tyne, and of the said District of Saint James and Saint Basil, Fenham, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Luke the Evangelist, Newcastle upon Tyne, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said District of Saint James and Saint Basil, Fenham.

“ And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“ The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Saint Luke the Evangelist, Newcastle upon Tyne, in the County of Northumberland and in the Diocese of Newcastle, and to be annexed to the District of Saint James and Saint Basil, Fenham, in the same County and Diocese being:—

“ All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Luke the Evangelist, Newcastle upon Tyne, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the north and upon the north west by the New Parish of All Saints, Gosforth, upon the south west by the New Parish of Saint Margaret, Scotswood, both in the said County and Diocese, upon the south east by the said District of Saint James and Saint Basil, Fenham, and upon the east by the western boundary of Nuns Moor.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Newcastle.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Saint Michael and All Angels, Blackburn, partly out of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Saint Mary, Mellor, and partly out of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint James, Blackburn, all in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Blackburn:

“ Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Blackburn, the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Mellor, and the said New Parish of Saint James, Blackburn, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Blackburn, of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Mellor, and of the said New Parish of Saint James, Blackburn, which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

“ And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

“ And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

“ And whereas there has been contributed and transferred to our name a sum of £1,370 £5 per centum War Stock (1929-1947) a sum of £500 Blackburn Corporation Mortgage and also a capital sum of £130 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church for the said proposed separate District:

“ And whereas the said sum of £1,370 £5 per centum War Stock (1929-1947) the said sum of £500 Blackburn Corporation Mortgage and the said capital sum of £130 have been contributed and transferred to us as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas the contributors of the above mentioned sums towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop of the Diocese for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Percy Mark, now Bishop of Blackburn (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Blackburn, of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Mellor, and of the said New Parish of Saint James, Blackburn, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named ‘The District of Saint Gabriel, Blackburn.’

“ And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted, and, when such District shall have become a

New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Percy Mark, Bishop of the said Diocese of Blackburn, and his successors for ever.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

" The District of Saint Gabriel, Blackburn, comprising:—

" All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Saint Michael and All Angels, Blackburn, of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Saint Mary, Mellor, and of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint James, Blackburn, all in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Blackburn, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of Ramsgreave Road near the eastern side of the bridge which carries such road across the Bolton, Blackburn and Helli-field Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Blackburn, the New Parish of Saint Peter, Salesbury, in the said County and Diocese, and the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Mellor, all meet, and extending thence first south westward, then southward and then again south westward along the middle of Ramsgreave Road (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Salesbury, from the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Mellor) for a distance of 1 mile and 12 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Barker's Lane, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Barker's Lane for a distance of 37 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Mellor, from the said New Parish of Saint James, Blackburn, and extending thence eastward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following the northern side of the footpath which leads past the southern side of the house and premises known as Key Fold into Pleckgate Road) for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the junction of such footpath with the footpath leading past the western side of Higher Waves Farmhouse into the new arterial road connecting the Preston Road with Whalley New Road, and extending thence south eastward to and along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the said arterial road and with the footpath leading into Pleckgate Road, near the house and premises known as Higher Wilworth, and extending thence first south eastward, then north eastward, then again

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Chipstable and Raddington duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Bath and Wells, and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Bath and Wells signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Chipstable and Raddington are now full, the Reverend James Maurice Ham being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Chipstable and the Reverend John Popham Hayne being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Raddington:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Chipstable and the said Benefice of Raddington shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Chipstable with Raddington' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Raddington only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Chipstable and the then Incumbent of Raddington shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Chipstable only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Raddington; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Raddington if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Chipstable shall have been instituted to Chipstable subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice; but if he shall have been instituted to Chipstable before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the Benefice of Chipstable

following such avoidance of the Benefice of Raddington and the then Incumbent of Raddington shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Chipstable shall become the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patrons of the said Benefice of Chipstable shall have the first and the third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Raddington shall have the second turn.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately

from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells.

Isolation of certain animals at Royal Agricultural Society's Show at Nottingham.

1.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority of the district, with a view to prevent the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease may by notice require the removal to a convenient and isolated place approved by him of any animal now at the Royal Agricultural Society's Show at Nottingham, which has been brought from any area which is after the movement of the animals to the said Show declared to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, and of any other animal at the Show which, in the opinion of the Minister or of the Local Authority, has been exposed to the risk of infection of Foot-and-Mouth Disease. This notice shall require any such animal to be detained and isolated at the said place of isolation until the notice is withdrawn by a further notice of an Inspector of the Ministry.

(2) A notice under this Article shall be served upon the owner of the animal, and a copy shall be sent to the Ministry, to the Local Authority and to the Secretary of the Show.

(3) The removal, detention and isolation of any animal under a notice served under this Article shall be carried out at the expense of the owner of the animal.

*Restriction of Movement of animals from
Royal Agricultural Society's Show at
Nottingham.*

2.—(1) No animal shall be moved out of the Show Ground of the Royal Agricultural Society situated at Nottingham, except with a licence granted by an Inspector or other officer of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, and then only to some suitable premises approved by the Inspector of the Ministry and subject to such conditions as the Minister considers necessary or expedient for the purpose of preventing the spread of disease, and are inserted in the licence.

(2) No licence shall be required under the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas

Restrictions) Order of 1925 in respect of any animal being moved from the Show with a licence under this Order.

3. The term "animal" in this Order means cattle, sheep, goats and swine.

Offences.

4. Any person committing, or aiding, abetting, counselling or procuring the commission of any breach of the provisions of this Order, is liable on summary conviction to the penalties provided by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927.
