

New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Percy Mark, Bishop of the said Diocese of Blackburn, and his successors for ever.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

" The District of Saint Gabriel, Blackburn, comprising:—

" All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Saint Michael and All Angels, Blackburn, of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Saint Mary, Mellor, and of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint James, Blackburn, all in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Blackburn, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of Ramsgreave Road near the eastern side of the bridge which carries such road across the Bolton, Blackburn and Helli-field Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Blackburn, the New Parish of Saint Peter, Salesbury, in the said County and Diocese, and the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Mellor, all meet, and extending thence first south westward, then southward and then again south westward along the middle of Ramsgreave Road (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Salesbury, from the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Mellor) for a distance of 1 mile and 12 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Barker's Lane, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Barker's Lane for a distance of 37 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Mellor, from the said New Parish of Saint James, Blackburn, and extending thence eastward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following the northern side of the footpath which leads past the southern side of the house and premises known as Key Fold into Pleckgate Road) for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the junction of such footpath with the footpath leading past the western side of Higher Waves Farmhouse into the new arterial road connecting the Preston Road with Whalley New Road, and extending thence south eastward to and along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the said arterial road and with the footpath leading into Pleckgate Road, near the house and premises known as Higher Wilworth, and extending thence first south eastward, then north eastward, then again

south eastward and then again north eastward along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 27½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Pleckgate Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint James Blackburn, from the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Blackburn, and extending thence first southward and then in various directions along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following in part the middle of Pleckgate Road and in part the middle of the roadway leading past Pleck Farmhouse and the houses and premises known as Lower Royslaw and Upper Royslaw) for a distance of 49 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the last mentioned roadway opposite to the middle of Sycamore Street, and extending thence north eastward to and along the middle of Sycamore Street for a distance of 22½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Teak Street, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Teak Street for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Whalley New Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Whalley New Road for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Clarendon Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Clarendon Road for a distance of 1½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the eastern side of Whalley New Road, and extending thence north westward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall forming the southern boundary of the premises belonging to Florence Mill, and extending thence north eastward along such wall and along the wall forming the south eastern boundary of the Blackburn Corporation Cemetery for a distance in all of 19 chains or thereabouts to the eastern end of the last mentioned wall, and continuing thence north eastward in precisely the same direction as the last mentioned wall and in a straight line for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the new arterial road connecting Brownhill Road with Whalley Old Road, and extending thence north eastward in a straight line for a distance of 10½ chains or thereabouts to the junction of Bank Hey Lane with Whalley Old Road upon the boundary which divides the New Parish of Saint Stephen, Blackburn, in the said County and Diocese, from the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Blackburn, and extending thence north eastward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of Whalley Old Road) for a distance of 64½ chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the New Parish of Saint Peter and Saint Paul, Rishton, in the said County and Diocese, from the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Blackburn, and extending thence first north eastward and then in various directions along the last mentioned boundary (thereby continuing in part to follow the middle of Whalley Old Road) for a distance of 46½ chains or thereabouts to the point in the middle of Knotts Brook where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Salesbury,
