

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, in pursuance of Section 86 (1) of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that on the 10th July he made Regulations, under Section 79 of the said Act, to apply to all factories or parts thereof in which horizontal milling machines are used. The Regulations, which may be cited as the Horizontal Milling Machines Regulations, 1928, will come into force on 1st September, 1928.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in attending nailing machines and inspecting boxes at the works of Messrs. C. Dickenson and Company, 5, Amberley Wharf, Paddington, W. 9, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks and that suitable accommodation for clothing put off during working hours, messroom accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided.

subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks and that suitable cloakroom and messroom accommodation shall be provided.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made Orders authorising the employment on two-day shifts, of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in machining metal nuts in the Machine Departments at the Hewell Road and Lodge Road Works of Messrs. Herbert Terry & Sons Ltd., Redditch, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable messroom accommodation and adequate accommodation for clothing put off during working hours shall be provided, and that employment in pursuance of the Orders shall be restricted to women and young persons living in Redditch.
