WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Burnley Rectory Act, 1890, do hereby subject as hereinafter mentioned grant to the incumbent of the Benefice of St. James, Burnley, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Blackburn, and to his successors incumbents of the same Benefice one yearly sum or stipend of thirty-seven pounds, ten shillings, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the Burnley Rectory (Capital) Account in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and to be calculated as from the first day of March in the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions on the first day of June and the first day of December in each year: Provided that the yearly sum hereby granted is in case of deficiency of income of the said Burnley Rectory (Capital) Account subject to abatement in accordance with the provisions of the said Act.

LIVERPOOL CORPORATION ACTS, 1921 AND 1927.

LIVERPOOL ELECTRICITY (EXTENSION) SPECIAL ORDER, 1922.

NOTICE is hereby given that an application has been made to the Electricity Commissioners by the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Liverpool for the consent of the Commissioners under Section 11 of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1919, to establish a Generating Station for the purposes of the Liverpool Corporation Acts, 1921 and 1927, and the Liverpool Electricity (Extension) Special Order, 1922, on that piece or parcel of land in the City and Parish of Liverpool containing 52,273 square yards or thereabouts and being the site of the Clarence Dock, bounded on the north by the Clarence Graving Dock, on the east by Waterloo Road, on the south by the Trafalgar Dock, and on the west by the Clarence Half Tide Dock.

A plan showing the land in question, together with a plan and an elevation drawing

of the generating station and a description of the machinery proposed to be installed therein, has been deposited for public inspection at the office of the Town Clerk of the City of Liverpool, Municipal Buildings, Dale Street, in the said City.

If the Joint Electricity Authority, Electricity Advisory Board or other body established for the Electricity District, the local authority or any owner or lessee of property situate within three hundred yards of the proposed site wish to state objections to the application, they must do so by registered letter addressed to the Secretary, Electricity Commission, Savoy Court, Strand, London, W.C. 2, within thirty days from the date hereof, and a copy of the objection must be addressed to me.

HENLEY-IN-ARDEN AND DISTRICT ELECTRICITY.

(Application for Special Order under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1926.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application has been made by the Leicestershire and Warwickshire Electric Power Company (hereinafter called "the Company") whose principal office is at 66, Queen Street, in the City of London, to the Electricity Commissioners for a Special Order under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1926, for the following amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorise the Company to supply and distribute electricity for all public and private purposes, as defined by the above Acts, within—

The Parishes of Bearley, Beaudesert, Claverdon, Langley, Preston Bagot, Wolverton and Wootton Wawen in the Rural District of Stratford-on-Avon;

The Parishes of Beausale, Budbrooke, Haseley, Hatton, Honiley, Norton Lindsey, Rowington, Shrewley and Wroxall in the Rural District of Warwick

all in the County of Warwick (hereinafter called "the area of supply").

2. To authorise the Company to exercise within the area of supply all the powers usually conferred on distributors of electricity.

3. To prescribe and limit the price to be charged for the supply of electricity.

4. To authorise the Company to break up streets and parts of streets not repairable by the local authority and railways within the area of supply.
