The following Statutes made by the University of Cambridge, on the 17th day of July, 1928, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923."

UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

STATUTES TO ALTER AND AMEND THE STATUTES IN RELATION TO THE UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE MADE UNDER "THE UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT 1923," (13 & 14 GEORGE V., CHAPTER 33), WHICH AMENDING STATUTES ARE NOW SUBMITTED FOR THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY THE KING IN COUNCIL.

We, the Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University of Cambridge in pursuance of the power given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do hereby alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said University in manner following, that is to say:—

STATUTE B.

MATRICULATION, RESIDENCE, DEGREES, DISCIPLINE.

CHAPTER I.

MATRICULATION.

By repealing in Section 1 of Chapter I the words "No one shall be matriculated unless

he is presented by a College, or has been approved as a Non-Collegiate Student," and substituting therefor the words "No one shall be matriculated unless he is presented by a College, or has been approved as a Non-Collegiate Student, or has been admitted to some office in the University."

STATUTE E.

TRUST EMOLUMENTS.

By making the following addition to Section 8 of Chapter I:—

"Women shall not be excluded from candidature for any such emolument on the sole ground that words of the masculine gender only are used in this Statute concerning the persons eligible to that emolument."

OBLIGATIONS OF COLLEGES.

CHAPTER II.

CONTRIBUTIONS OF COLLEGES FOR UNIVERSITY PURPOSES.

By deleting from Section 3 of Chapter II Sub-section (i) the words at the end of the Sub-section "the interest on investments representing accumulated fees (including composition fees) if such interest is not used for any purpose other than any of those for which the fees were paid."

By repealing Section 4 (Sub-section xvi) of the same Chapter and substituting therefor
