shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Canterbury.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 12th day of July, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint John, Chadderton, and of the New Parish of Christ Church, Chadderton, both in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 7th day of October, 1844, and published in the London Gazette on the 22nd day of the same month a separate District for spiritual purposes was constituted partly out of the Parochial Chapelry of Oldham, and partly out of the District of Hollinwood, both in the said County of Lancaster and at that time in the Diocese of Chester but now in the said Diocese of Manchester, and the said District was named 'The District of Saint John, Chadderton':

"And whereas the said District of Saint John, Chadderton, has become a New Parish of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

ter 94:

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 24th day of March, 1871, and published in the London Gazette on the 28th day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church called Christ Church, situate in the said New Parish of Saint John, Chadderton,

and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Christ Church, Chadderton':

"And whereas the said Consolidated Chapelry of Christ Church, Chadderton, has, under the provisions of the above mentioned Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act and by the above mentioned Acts of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint John, Chadderton, and of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Chadderton, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that, from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other gazetted Order, such duly boundaries of the said New Parish. of Saint John, Chadderton, and of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Chadderton, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint John, Chadderton, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Chadderton.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent up from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Saint John, Chadderton, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Christ Church, Chadderton, in the same County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint John, Chadderton, which is bounded upon the west by the said New Parish of Christ Church, Chadderton, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north east and upon the south east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Chadderton, from the said New Parish of Saint John, Chadderton, at a point on the eastern side of Block Lane opposite to the middle of Lincoln Street, and extending thence south eastward to and along the middle of Lincoln Street for a distance of 13½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Oxford Street and
