These Regulations provide for the operation of certain cmnibus journeys on Route No. 292 between Becontree (Five Elms) and Becontree Heath.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 23RD AUGUST, 1928.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 59).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Further Contraction of Preston (Lancs.) Footand-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 57) as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 58), shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the Schedule to the last-mentioned Order. (2) This Article shall come into operation on the thirty-first day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Release of Preston (Lancs.) Area from Restrictions.

2. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order shall cease to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, as from the sixth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 59).
