## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 21st September, 1928, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 24th September, 1928, to Saturday, the 29th September, 1928, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be

made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

## TIME FOR FILLING CASUAL VACANCIES.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department gives notice that by the Local Elections (District Councillors and Guardians, Alteration of Rules) Order, 1928, made by him on the 11th August, the provisions of Section 66 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as adapted and altered by the Election Orders made under Section 48 of the Local Government Act, 1888, in their application to the election of Urban and Rural District Councillors and Guardians respectively, have been further adapted and altered by the insertion at the end of sub-section (1) of the words "or, in the case of a vacancy by resignation, disqualification or absence, within one month of the office becoming vacant."

The effect of this amendment is to bring the Election Orders of 1898 for District Councillors and Guardians into conformity with the Metropolitan Borough Councillors Election Order, 1903.

THE LOCAL ELECTIONS (DISTRICT COUNCILLORS  
AND GUARDIANS, ALTERATION OF RULES)  
ORDER, 1928, DATED AUGUST 11, 1928, MADE  
BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE.

Whereas the Urban District Councillors Election Order, 1898, the Rural District Councillors Election Order, 1898, the Guardians (London) Election Order, 1898, and the Guardians (Outside London) Election Order, 1898, (hereinafter referred to as "the Orders") made under Section 48 of the Local Government Act, 1894, prescribe Rules with respect to the conduct of the election of District Councillors and Guardians respectively;

And whereas it is expedient to amend the provisions of the Orders relating to the time for filling casual vacancies;

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Sir William Joynson-Hicks, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of Section 48 of the Local Government Act, 1894, and Section 9 of the Poor Law Act, 1927, hereby Order as follows:—

Article I.—The provisions of Section 66 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882 ("Time for filling Casual Vacancies") as adapted and altered by the Orders in their application to the election of District Councillors and Guardians respectively shall be further adapted and altered as follows, that is to say:—

At the end of sub-section (1) of the said Section there shall be inserted the words "or, in the case of a vacancy by resignation, disqualification or absence, within one month of the office becoming vacant."

Article II.—This Order shall come into force on the first day of October nineteen hundred and twenty-eight except as respects any casual vacancy occurring before that date.

Article III.—This Order may be cited as "The Local Elections (District Councillors and Guardians, Alteration of Rules) Order, 1928."

**REGULATIONS RESPECTING COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATIONS OF SHORTHAND-TYPIST AND CLERK-SHORTHAND-TYPIST IN DEPARTMENTS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE.**

1. No candidate will be eligible who has not rendered, prior to the first day of the examination and within three years of that day, one full year's approved service in British Government Departments. She must have served for the year in one or more of the following posts :—

Established Typist in a Government Department;

Temporary Shorthand-Typist in a Government Department;

Established Clerk Typist in the Bankruptcy Departments of the Board of Trade or in the County Courts Branch of the Lord Chancellor's Department;

Temporary Clerk-Shorthand-Typist in the Bankruptcy Departments of the Board of Trade or in the Offices of His Majesty's Divisional Inspectors of Mines under the Mines Department.

Candidates appointed by the Civil Service Commissioners as Typists in the Trinity House, the Office of the Crown Agents for the Colonies, and the Metropolitan Police Office, on the result of a general competition for situations as Typist in the Civil Service, will be regarded as established Typists for the purpose of these regulations although not serving under the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

2. Candidates must be not less than 19 years of age on the first day of the examination, and candidates who have only temporary service or service in the Trinity House, Office of the Crown Agents for the Colonies, or the Metropolitan Police Office, or service of two or more of these kinds, must not be more than 40 years of age on the first day of the examination.

No exception on any grounds will be made to this rule.

3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners:—

(a) that they are unmarried or widows;

(b) that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

(1) Shorthand.

(2) English.

(3) General Paper.

Candidates must pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in Shorthand and in the aggregate of the three subjects.

5. It will rest with the Civil Service Commissioners to determine the Departments to which the successful candidates shall be assigned. In making the assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service and will consult, so far as possible, the wishes of Departments for the assignment of particular candidates who have served under them. Subject to these conditions, the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be respected.

6. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

7. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

8. A fee of 12s. 6d. will be required from every candidate attending the examination.
