Ambassador, desired of the King of Denmerk, ! that the Dantzicker Prizes taken by the Sieur Dr Bare, might remain at Copanhagen, and be depo-fited there till fuch time as the Most Christian King thall have received fatisfaction of the City of Dantzicke; Which the King of Desmark agreed to; Two of these Prizes, which were arrived before Copenhagen, were thereupon brought into that Port; Of the other 3, two are yet wanting, and the 3d being leaky, the French on board confented that she should return to Dantzick. Letters from Copenhagen add, that Count Lawenhaub was arrived there with the Character of Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Poland, and had a publick Audience of the King of Denmark; and from thence would go to the Court of Sue-den. They write from Stockhelm, that the Assem-bly of the States of that Kingdom was begun; and that the Solemnity of the deceafed Kings Funeral would be performed in few days. Letters from Hanouer give an account, that the Elector, who had been extream ill, was much better.

Paris, Nov. 25. Yesterday To Deum was Sung in the Chappel of Verfailles for the Peace; and this day the Soveraign Courts went thither, and com-plimented the King upon this Occasion. The Prince of Conti is shortly expected here, and his Coaches are fent to Dunkirke to meet him. Reform that is intended to be made of the French Forces is to take place the first day of the next month, and we hear 'tis to be, by reducing the number of the several Troops and Companies. The King has named the Marquis de Harceurs to go his Ambassador to Spain.

Brussels. Nov. 29. The French have demolish-

ed the Line or Intrenchment they made about two years ago between Courtray and the Schelde; and have fent to the Elector of Bavaria to acquaint him, that they are ready to evacuate Courtray, Aeth, and Charleroy; 'Tis faid the first will be delivered up to morrow or the day following, and his Electoral Highness has ordered 3 Battalions to march thither, who are to take possession of the Town, and to remain in Garison there; and Ash and Charleroy will be restored in 2 or 3 days after; but no time is yet fet for the giving up of Luxemburg and Mons; Though they have already removed from this last place all their Artillery, Ammunition, and Provisions. The Troops that are to enter into these Garisons have in the mean time orders to be in a readiness to march upon the first notice.

Hague, Nov. 29. N. S. Count Balliany, Envoy from the Duke of Mantua, had yesterday his first Audience of the States; and this day the Pre-fident de la Tour had his Audience of Leave, and delivered a Letter from the Duke of Savoy his Master, complimenting the States upon the Peace, and thanking them for the Assistance he received from them in the late War. Count Caunitz, the Emperor's Minister, has taken his leave, and intends to return to Germany in a day or two; Monsieur Harlay, one of the French Ambassadors, has done the like, and will begin his Journey to France to morrow or the day following. The States will in few days name an Ambassador to France; They have resolved to give Pentions to such Officers as they have disbanded. Monsieur Bosin is gone to Amsterdam upon some Business from the King of Poland his Master, to the Moscowy Ambassadors, and is expected back to morrow. The French Ambassadors have received Letters from France, which acquaint them, that Orders are sent for evacuating the Places to be restored to Spain.
