ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 19TH OCTOBER, 1928.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Authorisation of Landing of Pedigree Cattle from South Africa.

1. The landing of the cattle described in the First Schedule hereto is hereby allowed, sub-

ject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the landing and detention of the cattle under this Order.

Place of Landing.

3. The cattle shall be landed at the Quay facing the River Itchen, situate at the south

end of Southampton Docks, in the county borough of Southampton.

Regulations Applicable to Animals before and on Landing.

4.—(1) The cattle shall not be landed in Great Britain unless and until there are delivered to a proper officer of Customs and Excise the certificates and declarations prescribed by this Article, namely:—

(a) a certificate signed by a duly authorised officer of the Government of the Union of South Africa to the effect that at the time of the shipment of the animals both the cattle and also the whole of the Union were free from foot-and-mouth disease, contagious pleuro-pneumonia and cattle-plague;

(b) a certificate signed by a duly authorised officer of the Government of the Union of South Africa to the effect that the animals were, for a period of not less than one calendar month immediately preceding shipment from South Africa, detained and isolated on premises approved by and under the control of the Veterinary Department of the Government of the Union of South Africa;

(c) a statutory declaration from the shipper that the fodder and litter accompanying the cattle are products of the Union of South Africa;

(d) a statutory declaration from the Master of the Vessel in which the cattle are carried to Great Britain that during the whole of the voyage from South Africa no other cattle, sheep, goats, other ruminating animals or swine have been carried on the vessel; that no other fodder or litter for the use of any animal on the vessel has been shipped during the voyage to Great Britain at any port or place outside the Union of South Africa, and that whilst the said cattle were on board, the vessel did not enter a port in a prohibited country for the purposes of the Foreign Animals Order of 1910.

(2) The animals, before being landed, shall be examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry, and if found by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease, shall forthwith be landed and moved by railway under the supervision of the Inspector from the place of landing to the Foreign Animals Quarantine Station described in the Second Schedule hereto.

(3) The animals shall be detained in the said Quarantine Station until the expiration of a period of at least three calendar months from the date of shipment from the Union of South Africa: Provided that the period of detention of the cattle at the said Quarantine Station shall be not less than two calendar months from the date of their arrival therein.

(4) Whilst detained in the said Quarantine Station the animals shall be under the control of a Veterinary Inspector appointed by the Ministry.

(5) During such period of detention no other animals shall be moved into the said Quarantine Station, and the animals landed under this Order shall be kept separate from all other animals.

(6) During such period of detention the animals and the Foreign Animals Quarantine Station hereby defined shall be subject to such rules as may be prescribed by the Ministry for

the purpose of preventing the spread of disease.

(7) In the event of contagious pleuro-pneumonia, foot-and-mouth disease, or cattle plague being found to exist during the prescribed period of detention in any animal referred to in this Order, the Ministry shall cause to be slaughtered all the animals in the consignment, and in the event of any such disease being suspected to exist in any such animal, the Ministry may cause the slaughter of such of the animals as may be deemed necessary for the purpose of diagnosis. No compensation shall be payable by the Ministry in respect of any animal slaughtered under this Order.

(8) The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries may, if he thinks fit, cause the tuberculin or any other test to be applied to the animals landed under this Order whilst they are detained in the said Quarantine Station.

Disinfection of Vessel, etc.

5. The vessel from which the animals are landed and the fittings, dung, fodder, litter and other things used for or about the animals, shall be disinfected or disposed of in accordance with such rules as may be prescribed by the Ministry.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Isolation of certain animals at the British Dairy Farmers' Association's Show at the Royal Agricultural Hall, London.

1.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority of the District, with a view to prevent the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease may by notice require the removal to a convenient and isolated place approved by him of any animal now at the British Dairy Farmers' Association's Show at the Royal Agricultural Hall, London, which has been brought from any area which is after the movement of the animals to the said Show declared to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, and of any other animal at the Show which, in the opinion of the Minister or of the Local Authority, has been exposed to the risk of infection of Foot-and-Mouth Disease. This notice shall require any such animal to be detained and isolated at the said place of isolation until the notice is withdrawn by a further notice of an Inspector of the Ministry.

(2) A notice under this Article shall be served upon the owner of the animal, and a copy shall be sent to the Ministry, to the Local Authority and to the Secretary of the Show.

(3) The removal, detention and isolation of any animal under a notice served under this Article shall be carried out at the expense of the owner of the animal.

Restriction of Movement of animals from the British Dairy Farmers' Association's Show at the Royal Agricultural Hall, London.

2.—(1) No animal shall be moved out of the Show Ground of the British Dairy Farmers' Association at the Royal Agricultural Hall, London, except with a licence granted by an Inspector or other officer of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, and then only to some suitable premises approved by the Inspector of the Ministry and subject to such conditions as the Minister considers necessary or expedient for the purpose of preventing the spread of disease, and are inserted in the licence.

(2) No licence shall be required under the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 in respect of any animal being moved from the Show with a licence under this Order.

3. The term "animal" in this Order means cattle, sheep, goats and swine.

Offences.

4. Any person committing, or aiding, abetting, counselling or procuring the commission of any breach of the provisions of this Order, is liable on summary conviction to the penalties provided by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927.

BYE-LAWS RELATING TO THE CONVEYANCE, EMBARKATION AND DISEMBARKATION OF PASSENGERS, ANIMALS AND GOODS BETWEEN PLACES IN HAMPSHIRE AND THE ISLE OF WIGHT.

BYE-LAWS made by the SOUTHERN RAILWAY COMPANY, with the approval of the Minister of Transport, in relation to passengers, animals, and goods, conveyed in or upon their steam and other vessels, plying between places in Hampshire and the Isle of Wight, and in relation to the embarkation or disembarkation of passengers, animals, and goods, on or from such vessels, by virtue of the Acts: 42 Vict. c. XXX, 26 and 27 Vict. c. 92, and in exercise of every other power in that behalf vested in the Southern Railway Company.

Definitions.

1. In these bye-laws, unless therein otherwise expressly provided, or unless the context shall otherwise require, the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them:—

"The Company."

"The Company" shall mean the Southern Railway Company.

"Vessel."

"Vessel" shall mean any steam vessel, or other vessel of any description, used by the Company for the conveyance or carriage of passengers, animals, minerals, goods, merchandize or things of any description between any ports or places in Hampshire (including the town and county of the town of Southampton), or between any of those places on the one hand and any port or place in the Isle of Wight on the other hand, or between any ports or places in the Isle of Wight, or between any of those ports and places.

"Person."

"Person" shall include a corporation whether aggregate or sole.

Number.

Words importing the singular shall include the plural, and words importing the plural shall include the singular.

Gender.

Words importing the masculine gender shall include females.

Passengers to obtain tickets.

2. No passenger, without the permission of the Company, shall embark on a vessel, for the purpose of travelling thereon, unless he, or someone on his behalf, shall have obtained from the Company, or their Agent, a ticket entitling him to travel on the vessel, but, if the Company shall give permission to any passenger to embark without a ticket entitling him to travel therein, he shall obtain such ticket from the Company's duly authorised servant or agent on board such vessel as soon as may be reasonably practicable.

Issue of tickets at intermediate ports.

3. At any intermediate port or place, fares will be received and tickets issued conditionally only on there being room in the vessel for which such tickets shall be issued. In case there shall not be sufficient room for all the passengers to or for whom any such tickets shall have been issued, the holders of such as shall be for the longest distances, shall, as far as may be reasonably practicable, have preference, and the holders of such as shall be for the same distance, shall as far as may be reasonably practicable, have priority according to the order in which such tickets shall have been issued, as denoted by the numbers stamped thereon. The Company are not, however, to be deemed to undertake that such order of preference or priority shall be adhered to.

Fares to intermediate ports.

4. When the fare to an intermediate port or place exceeds the fare to a more distant port or place, no person shall, for the purpose of travelling to such intermediate port or place, take or use, or attempt to use, a ticket for the more distant port or place, with intent to avoid payment of the additional fare to such intermediate port or place. The liability to, or the infliction of, any penalty incurred by the infraction of this bye-law shall not prejudice any right of the Company to treat such ticket as forfeited, and to recover the full fare for the distance actually travelled by the offender.

*Altering or defacing tickets, &c.**Using altered tickets, &c.*

5. No person shall (a) alter, deface, mutilate or destroy any passenger ticket, season ticket, dog ticket, bicycle ticket, or other ticket, after it has been issued and whilst it is available for use, with intent to enable the Company to be defrauded or prejudiced; or (b) knowingly and wilfully use, or attempt to use, any passenger ticket, season ticket, dog ticket, or bicycle ticket, or other ticket, which shall have been in any respect materially altered, defaced or mutilated.

*Selling, buying or transferring tickets, &c.**Using transferred tickets, &c.*

6. No person shall (a) sell or buy, or attempt to sell or buy, any ticket (which expression in this bye-law includes any passenger ticket, season ticket, dog ticket, bicycle ticket, book of passenger tickets, or other ticket, and any

portion detached from the remainder of any such ticket or book) or transfer or receive any partly used ticket, or any season ticket, to or from any other person with intent that any person shall use the same for the purpose of travelling or conveyance upon any vessel, unless the ticket shall, at the time of issuing thereof, purport to be transferable, or (b) knowingly and wilfully use, or attempt to use, any ticket which has been sold, bought, transferred or received in contravention of this bye-law.

Provided that the sale, or attempted sale, by, or the purchase, or attempted purchase from, a duly authorised servant or agent of the Company is excepted from the provisions of this bye-law.

Entry on any part of vessel not provided for passengers, &c.

7. No passenger shall, without the permission of an officer of the vessel, enter or remain on or in any part of a vessel other than that provided for the conveyance of passengers, or on or in any part of a vessel which may be enclosed by chain, rope, or other barrier, or which may bear a notice that it is reserved.

*Entering or leaving vessel in motion, &c.**User of gangways.*

8. No person (except in case of accident or other emergency) shall enter or leave, or attempt to enter or leave, any vessel whilst it is in motion, or otherwise than by a gangway; and where on any vessel one gangway is provided for entrance thereto and another gangway for exit therefrom, no person (except as aforesaid) shall embark or disembark, or attempt to embark or disembark, on or from such vessel, except by the gangway provided for entrance or exit respectively.

Persons suffering from infectious or contagious disease, &c.

9. The Company may refuse to receive or carry on board any vessel any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease or disorder; and if any person so suffering shall enter or attempt to enter, or if any person having the charge or direction of any person so suffering shall cause or permit such person to enter or attempt to enter, any vessel without first giving notice of such infectious or contagious disease or disorder to the officer of the Company in charge of embarkation, or to the Master or other Officer of the vessel, he shall be guilty of an offence against this bye-law; provided always that it shall be a good defence if he shows that he was not aware of and did not suspect and had no reason to suspect the existence of such infectious or contagious disease or disorder.

Intoxicated persons, &c.

10. (a) No person in a state of intoxication, or who is in an unfit or improper condition to travel, shall enter any vessel; and

(b) Except by permission of a servant or agent of the Company, no person shall enter a cabin whose dress or clothing is in a condition liable to soil or injure the linings or cushions thereof or the dress or clothing of any passenger travelling therein.

Male passengers not to travel in any part of vessel reserved for females.

11. Except by permission of a servant or agent of the Company, no person of the male sex, above the age of eight years, shall travel or attempt to travel or remain in any cabin or other part of a vessel marked or notified as being reserved or appropriated for the exclusive use of persons of the female sex.

Offensive animals or goods.

12. The Company may refuse to receive or carry on board any vessel any animal or goods of an offensive nature; and if any person shall send or attempt to send by any vessel or carry or attempt to carry in any vessel any animal or goods of an offensive nature without first giving notice of the offensive nature thereof to the Officer of the Company in charge of embarkation, or to the Master or other Officer of the vessel, he shall be guilty of an offence against this bye-law; provided always that it shall be a good defence if he shows that he was not aware and did not suspect and had no reason to suspect that the animal or goods, as the case may be, were of an offensive nature.

In this bye-law, the expression "offensive nature" means a nature, quality or condition calculated or likely to cause injury or annoyance to any person on board the vessel or damage to any property thereon.

Dogs, &c.

13. (i) No person shall send, or attempt to send, by any vessel, or carry or attempt to carry in any vessel, any dog, bird, animal or other creature unless the same shall be properly and sufficiently secured, or otherwise under proper and sufficient control.

(ii) No person having the charge of any dog, bird, animal, or other creature in any vessel shall (a) take the same or cause or permit the same to be taken into or allow the same to remain in any cabin if requested not to do so by a servant or agent of the Company; or (b) permit the same to cause annoyance or injury to any person or damage to any property.

Bookmaking, betting or wagering, &c.

14. (a) No person shall enter on, or use, any vessel for the purpose of bookmaking or betting or wagering, or agreeing to bet or wager, or paying or receiving or settling bets with any other person.

Playing games.

(b) No person playing for money or moneysworth at any game or pretended game of chance and or skill in or upon any vessel shall continue to do so after having been requested by any servant or agent of the Company to desist therefrom.

Loitering, &c.

(c) No person shall, without lawful justification or excuse, enter, loiter or remain on any vessel. Any person entering, or who shall have entered, on a vessel, shall, whenever required so to do by any duly authorised servant of the Company, truly inform him of the respects in which such person claims to be entitled to be thereon.

Discorderly conduct, &c.

15. No person shall at any time, while in or upon a vessel, (a) use any threatening, abusive, indecent, obscene, profane, or offensive

language to the annoyance or hindrance of any other person; or (b) behave in a riotous, disorderly, indecent or offensive manner, to the annoyance or hindrance of any other person; or (c) write, draw, or affix any abusive, indecent, obscene, profane, or offensive word, representation, or characters, upon any part of the vessel or the equipment thereof; or (d) commit any nuisance; or (e) molest, or wilfully interfere with the comfort or convenience of, any passenger or person, or (f) without the permission in writing of the Company's Docks and Marine Manager for the time being, play any instrument, sing, or dance.

Smoking.

16. No person shall smoke in any cabin in any vessel which is not provided for smoking, or in or upon any part of the vessel where smoking is expressly prohibited by the Company, or, if requested by any servant or agent of the Company not to do so, in or upon any part of the vessel where smoking may be dangerous.

Hawking, touting, &c.

17. Except by permission in writing from the Company's Docks and Marine Manager for the time being, no person, while in or upon a vessel, shall hawk, sell, or expose or offer for sale, any article or goods whatsoever, or tout, ply for, or solicit alms, reward, custom or employment of any description.

Throwing articles from vessel, &c.

18. No person shall pour, throw or drop from any vessel, any liquid, article, matter or thing whatsoever in such manner as to be calculated or likely to soil, damage or injure any person or property.

Spitting.

19. No person shall spit upon the deck, or upon any other part of any vessel, or any place used for the embarkation or disembarkation of passengers.

Interfering with machinery, &c.

20. No person shall improperly, wantonly or maliciously interfere with, or move or set in motion, any machinery, gangway, mooring, plant, lights, fittings, signals, appliance or equipment used or provided on or in connection with any vessel.

Damaging Property.

21. No person shall wilfully, wantonly or maliciously break, cut, scratch, tear, soil, deface, damage or remove any part of a vessel, or any of the fittings, furniture, decorations or equipment thereof, or any plant, appliance or property used or provided on or in connection therewith, or any notice, advertisement, number-plate, number, figure or letter therein or thereon.

Obstruction, &c.

22. No person shall wilfully do or cause to be done anything in such a manner (a) as to obstruct or injure any part of the machinery or tackle used in the mooring of a vessel or in the loading or unloading thereof or in the embarkation or disembarkation thereof; or (b) as to obstruct, impede or molest the servants of the Company or any of them in the mooring of a vessel, or in the loading or unloading thereof, or in the embarkation or disembarka-

tion thereof, or otherwise in the execution of their duty in, about or in connection with a vessel.

Leaving animals or articles on vessel.

23. No person shall leave or place any animal, vehicle, cycle or any luggage, goods, article or thing, or cause the same to be left or placed, on, in or about any vessel in contravention of any reasonable direction of an officer of the vessel.

Lost Property, &c.

24. Every person who shall find in or upon any vessel any article or thing, which shall have been lost or mislaid, shall hand the same or give a full description thereof to an officer or servant of the Company without delay, unless the article or thing has been delivered to the owner.

Penalties.

25. Any person doing anything prohibited by, or otherwise offending against, any of the foregoing bye-laws numbered 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 23 and 24 respectively, shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding fortyshillings for a first offence, and not exceeding £5 for any subsequent offence; and any person doing anything prohibited by, or otherwise offending against, any of the foregoing bye-laws numbered 20, 21 and 22 respectively, shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Power to interfere to obviate or remove danger, &c.

26. If the infraction or non-observance of any of the foregoing bye-laws be attended with danger or annoyance to the public or hindrance to the Company in the lawful use of the vessel, it shall be lawful for the Company summarily to interfere to obviate or remove such danger, annoyance or hindrance, and that without prejudice to any penalty incurred by the infraction of any such bye-law.
