The following Statute made by the Governing Body of the College or Hall of the Holy Trinity, in the University of Cambridge, on the 12th day of October, 1928, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

STATUTE TO ALTER AND AMEND THE STATUTES OF THE COLLEGE OR HALL OF THE HOLY TRINITY IN THE UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE, WHICH AMENDING STATUTE HAVING BEEN DULY MADE AT A GENERAL MEETING OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE SAID COLLEGE OR HALL (SPECIALLY SUMMONED FOR THIS PURPOSE AND HELD ON THE 12TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1928, NOTICE OF THE PROPOSED AMENDING STATUTE HAVING BEEN GIVEN TO THE UNIVERSITY) AND PASSED AT SUCH MEETING BY THE VOTES OF ALL PERSONS PRESENT AND VOTING IS NOW SUBMITTED FOR THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY THE KING IN COUNCIL.

We, the Master, Fellows and Scholars of the College or Hall of the Holy Trinity in the University of Cambridge, do hereby in pursuance of the power given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to

our said College or Hall in manner following, that is to say:—

STATUTE XII.

COLLEGE MEETINGS.

By adding the following paragraph to Section 3 of this Statute:—

"When the Mastership is about to become vacant at a known date by resignation or superannuation, an election to the Mastership may be made not more than six calendar months before the date of the vacancy, by the same procedure as if the Mastership had already become vacant. Such election shall take effect from the date on which the Mastership becomes vacant. The Master shall not be present at any meeting at which an election to the Mastership is made and no business not immediately connected with election to the Mastership shall be transacted at any such meeting."
