

gesses of the Borough of Blackpool and any Lessee or other persons for the time being working the Tramways hereinafter defined; "Tramways" means the Tramway and Motor Omnibus System worked by the Corporation, whether situate within the County Borough of Blackpool, or in any other district where the Corporation have running powers; "Car" means any Carriage or Car run upon the Tramways and belonging to the Corporation, and any Motor Omnibus owned and used by the Corporation for the conveyance of passengers; "Passenger" means every person being carried or conveyed upon or by a car; "Conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having charge of, or helping in the charge of a Car; "Driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a car; "Tramway Premises" means any Station, Waiting Room, or other premises used in connection with the Tramways.

Offensive Language or Conduct.

2. No person shall swear or use obscene, indecent or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any Car or Tramway Premises, or spit, or commit any nuisance in, upon, from, or against any Car or Tramway Premises, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

No person shall, whilst travelling in or upon any Car, or whilst upon any Tramway Premises, sing or play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or throw down and leave in or upon Tramway Premises or any Car, any waste paper or other refuse, or deposit remnants of food or fruit or any objectionable matter in or upon any Tramway Premises or any Car.

Objectionable Persons.

3. No person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious or infectious disorder, and no person who from any other cause or for any other reason in the opinion of the Conductor might be offensive or objectionable to any passenger, shall board or enter any Car, and any such person, found in or upon any Car shall leave the Car on being requested by the Conductor to do so, and on his refusal he may be immediately removed from the Car by or under the direction of the Conductor.

Dogs.

4. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any Car, except by permission of the Conductor or the Tramways General Manager. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any Car shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the Car immediately upon request by the Conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, such dog or other animal may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor.

Damage to Car.

5. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the seats, cushions, curtains or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed

or other notice in or on any Car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any Car or its equipment.

Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage so done.

Smoking.

6. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette in or upon any Car, except in a compartment or on seats especially set apart for the purpose.

Payment of Fares.

7. Each passenger shall pay to the Conductor the fare legally demandable for the journey, whether the same shall or shall not be demanded.

Upon payment of the fare, the Conductor shall give, and the passenger shall accept, a ticket for the journey or stage in respect of which the fare is paid. Such ticket shall only be available by the Car on which it is issued, and by the passenger to whom it is given, or in respect of whom it is issued.

Each passenger on a one-man operated vehicle shall tender his fare on entering the vehicle unless such fare shall have been previously paid to an authorised conductor.

Tickets.

8. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required to do so to the Conductor, or other duly authorised servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required to do so, either deliver up his ticket in such a condition that the number and other material portion thereof can be read and identified, or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Offensive Clothing.

9. No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the Conductor of a Car, soil, injure, or damage the seats, linings, curtains, or cushions of the Car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, shall enter, or remain in or upon any Car and the Conductor may prevent any such person entering the Car.

No such person shall enter in or upon any Car after having been requested not to do so by the Conductor, and if any such person be found in or upon any Car, he shall on the request of the Conductor, leave such Car upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned or tendered to him, and on his refusal to do so he may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor.

Provided that no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon a Car under the provisions of this Bye-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

Provided further that on top covered Cars any such person as last mentioned shall, if so directed by the Conductor, travel on the upper deck when there is seating accommodation available thereon.

Interference with the Duties of Driver or Conductor.

10. No person other than the Conductor or Driver shall change or remove the route indi-
