At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 1st day of *November*, 1928.

PRESENT,

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 25th day of September, 1928, (G.H.), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 30 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted that the Admiralty, with the approval of Your Majesty in Council, may, from time to time, make free grants of land, part of the lands vested in them by virtue of this Act, for the erection of buildings, and providing conveniences for places of worship, residence of Ministers, education of children or other public purposes (so that any such grant of land does not include any right to the minerals under the land granted, or comprise more than two acres in any one parish):

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the free grant to the East Suffolk County Council of a piece of land measuring 1,785 square yards or thereabouts at present vested in the Admiralty by virtue of the aforesaid Act, for the purpose of the widening of the Holbrook-Stutton Road.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with

the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 10th day of October, 1928 (N.P.(1)2835/28), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 9th day of March, 1921, to sanction

subject to certain conditions the payment of Hard Lying Money to Officers and Men employed in various small craft, including Surveying Ships:

"And whereas under one of the conditions prescribed in that Order, Hard Lying Money may not be paid to Officers unless the living and sleeping conditions on board are markedly inferior to those in Torpedo Boat Destroyers:

"And whereas the aforesaid condition is not fulfilled in Surveying Ships, but we are nevertheless of opinion that in view of the inevitable discomfort of service in such ships abroad Hard Lying Money should be paid to such of the Officers of those vessels as are not in receipt of Surveying Pay:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to empower us, at our discretion, and with effect from the 1st day of April, 1928, to grant Hard Lying Money at the rates authorised for service in Torpedo Boat Destroyers to such of the Officers serving in Surveying Ships abroad as are not in receipt of Surveying Pay, provided that

(1) they actually live and sleep on board the vessels,

(2) the vessels are mainly employed on sea service, and

(3) the living and sleeping conditions are not superior to those in Torpedo Boat Destroyers.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 15th day of October, 1928 (C.W. 9052/28), in the words following, viz.:-

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 25th day of July, 1927, to sanction, *inter*

alia, the grant of charge pay on the following scale to Medical Officers of Your Majesty's Navy in charge of hospitals and sick quarters:-

Surgeon Rear-Admirals and Surgeon Captains, 10s. a day.

Surgeon Commanders, 5s. a day:

"And whereas we consider that in view of the responsibilities devolving upon Medical Officers in charge of Hospital Ships, they should similarly receive extra remuneration:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of Medical Officers in charge of Hospital Ships being granted at our discretion, with effect from the 15th day of September, 1928, charge pay on the scale laid down for Medical Officers in charge of hospitals and sick quarters.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order of His Majesty in Council bearing date the twentieth day of February, 1924, and entitled "The Northern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1924" (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order"), provision was made for the peace, order and good government of Northern Rhodesia:

And whereas it is expedient to amend certain provisions of the said Principal Order in the manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in that behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:-

1. This Order may be cited as The Northern Rhodesia (Amendment) Order in Council, 1928, and shall be construed and read as one with the Principal Order.

2. Articles 32, 33, 34 and 35 of the Principal Order are hereby repealed and the following provisions substituted therefor:-

"32. Courts subordinate to the High Court and Courts of special jurisdiction may be constituted by or under the provisions of any Ordinance as occasion requires.

"33. Provision may be made by Ordinance for the hearing and determining of appeals from any such Court by the High Court or otherwise.

" 34. Article 15 of this Order shall apply to the appointment of all Judges and Magistrates (other than Judges of the High Court) and to Registrars and other principal officers of the High Court in like manner as it applies to public officers."

3. Pending the constitution of other Courts in substitution for Magistrates' Courts and Native Commissioners' Courts constituted under Articles 32, 33, 34 and 35 of the Principal Order hereby repealed all Courts constituted thereby and thereunder shall continue to exercise the jurisdiction prescribed by any law for the time being in force in the Territory.

4. Article 36 of the Principal Order is hereby repealed and the following provision substituted therefor:—

" 36. In civil cases between Natives every Court shall

(a) be guided by native law so far as it is applicable and is not repugnant to natural justice or morality or inconsistent with any Order in Council, Ordinance or Proclamation or any Regulation or Rule made under any Order in Council, Ordinance or Proclamation, and shall

(b) decide all such cases according to substantial justice without undue regard to technicalities of procedure and without delay. In all other respects the Court shall follow as far as possible the procedure observed in similar cases in England."

5. His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in Council may from time to time revoke add to or amend this Order.

6. This Order shall come into operation forthwith and shall be published in the Northern Rhodesia Gazette and thereafter the Governor shall give directions for the further publication of this Order at such places and in such manner or for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 18 of "The Extradition Act, 1870," it is among other things enacted, that if by any law made after the passing of the said Act by the legislature of any British possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within such possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, such British possession His Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Act in the case of any foreign state, or by any subsequent Order, either

suspend the operation within any such British possession of the said Act, or of any

part thereof so far as it relates to such foreign state, and so long as such law continues in force there and no longer;

or direct that such law or ordinance or any part thereof shall have effect in such British possession, with or without modifications and alterations, as if it were part of the Act:

And whereas by an ordinance enacted by the legislature of the Colony of Kenya, the short title of which is "The Extradition Ordinance, 1928," it is provided that all powers vested in and acts authorised or required to be done by a Police Magistrate or any Justice of the Peace in relation to the surrender of fugitive criminals in the United Kingdom under the Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, are thereby vested in and may in the Colony be exercised and done by any Magistrate holding a Subordinate Court of the first class in relation to the surrender of fugitive criminals under the said Acts:

And whereas it is further provided by the said ordinance that the said ordinance shall not come into operation until His Majesty shall by Order in Council direct that the said ordinance shall have effect within the Colony as if it were part of the Extradition Act, 1870, but that the said ordinance shall thereafter come into operation as soon as such Order in Council shall have been publicly made known in the Colony:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of "The Extradition Act, 1870," and in exercise of the power in that behalf in the said Act contained, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, direct that the said ordinance shall have effect in the Colony of Kenya without modification or alteration, as if it were part of the Extradition Act, 1870.

And the Right Honourable Leopold Charles Maurice Stennett Amery, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, as modified by Article 14 of the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of the Taxing Acts) Order, 1922, and by Article 2 of the Irish Free State (Consequential Adaptation of Enactments) Order, 1923, it is enacted that His Majesty the King may, by Order in Council, apply that Section to any British Possession where His Majesty is satisfied that by the Law of such Possession, either no duty is leviable in respect of property situate in Great Britain when passing on death or that the Law of such Possession as respects any duty so leviable is to the like effect as the foregoing provisions of that Section:

And whereas by Section 45 of the Finance Act, 1922, it is enacted that the said Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, shall have effect as if the Unfederated Malay States of Johore, Kedah, Perlis, Kelantan, Trengganu and Brunei were British Possessions within the meaning of that Section :

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that by the Law of the Unfederated Malay States of Johore, Kedah, Perlis, Kelantan, Trengganu and Brunei either no duty is leviable in respect of property situate in Great Britain when passing on death or that the law as respects the duty so leviable is to the like effect as the provisions of sub-section (1) of the aforesaid Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894 :

And whereas it is expedient that Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, should be applied to the Unfederated Malay States of Johore, Kedah, Perlis, Kelantan, Trengganu and Brunei :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the power by the aforesaid Acts in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, shall apply to the Unfederated Malay States of Johore, Kedah, Perlis, Kelantan, Trengganu and Brunei as from the 1st day of November, 1928.

And the Right Honourable Leopold Maurice Stennett Amery, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 11th day of October, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say :—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Emmanuel, Sparkbrook, situate in the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of Christ Church, Sparkbrook, in the County of Warwick and in the Diocese of Birmingham :

" Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Emmanuel, Sparkbrook, situate as aforesaid :

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Sparkbrook, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Emmanuel, Sparkbrook, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ' The District Chapelry of Emmanuel, Sparkbrook. '

" And with the like consent of the said Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Emmanuel, Sparkbrook, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being. Provided always that, so long as the Reverend George Nesbitt Haydon Tredennick, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Birmingham, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Sparkbrook, shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent, all the fees or dues which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization, or performance at the said Church of Emmanuel, Sparkbrook, situate as aforesaid, shall be paid over by the Minister thereof to the said George Nesbitt Haydon Tredennick.

" We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

" THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

" The District Chapelry of Emmanuel, Sparkbrook, being :—

" All that part of the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of Christ Church, Sparkbrook, in the County of Warwick and in the Diocese of Birmingham which is bounded upon the north east partly by the New Parish of All Saints, Small Heath, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Gregory, Small Heath, upon the south by the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Sparkhill, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Sparkhill, from the said New Parish of Christ

Church, Sparkbrook, at the junction of Warwick Road with Medicott Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Medicott Road for a distance of 23 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Abbotsford Road and Cartland Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Cartland Road for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Anderton Road and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Anderton Road for a distance of 27 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Golden Hillock Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Golden Hillock Road for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such road across the Oxford and Birmingham Line of the Great Western Railway upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Sparkbrook, from the said New Parish of All Saints, Small Heath."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Birmingham.
