

At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 20th day of *November*, 1928.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 15th day of November, 1928, (C.W. 10246/28), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we have decided in the interests of economy that all docking work on the Destroyers in Maintenance Reserve at Rosyth is to be performed by naval ratings under the direction of the Shipwright Officer of the Parent Ship:

"And whereas we consider that the additional work and responsibility thereby devolving on this Officer should be recognised by the grant of extra remuneration:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the grant to him, with effect from the 28th day of May, 1928, of an allowance of 10s. for each successful docking or undocking operation.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend Thomas Banks, Lord Bishop of Oxford, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"We, Thomas Banks, Lord Bishop of Oxford, in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

"There is in the County of Buckingham and our Diocese of Oxford the Rectory or Benefice of Farnham Royal the Parish whereof contains a population of three thousand or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for three hundred and forty persons

and in the Church of St. John's for two hundred and fifty persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Farnham Royal is Seven hundred and sixty pounds or thereabouts.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Rectory or Benefice of Hedgerley the Parish whereof contains a population of one hundred and fifty or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for one hundred and eighty persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Hedgerley is Two hundred and ninety pounds or thereabouts.

"A certain portion of the said Parish of Farnham Royal (being part of the well defined district known as Hedgerley Dean) with a total population of two hundred and ten or thereabouts is distant about two and a half miles from the Parish Church of Farnham Royal and a few hundred yards from the Parish Church of Hedgerley.

"It appears to us and we do hereby represent to your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, the said portion of the Parish of Farnham Royal (which portion is more particularly delineated on the plan annexed to the Scheme appended to this Representation and thereon coloured pink) may be advantageously separated therefrom and annexed to the said Parish of Hedgerley to which it is contiguous.

"The Provost of the College Royal of the Blessed Mary of Eton near unto Windsor in the County of Buckingham and the same College are the Patrons of the said Benefice of Farnham Royal and the Reverend Allix Francis Gamul Farmer is the present Incumbent thereof.

Mabel Grace Norris (wife of Hugh Littleton Norris), of Michelmersh Court, Romsey, in the County of Hants, is the Patron of the said Benefice of Hedgerley and the Reverend William O'Connor is the present Incumbent thereof.

"Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, we, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect of Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, Glebe lands, Tithe rent charges and other Ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the Patrons of both of the said Benefices of Farnham Royal and Hedgerley and also the consents of the Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—
