

6. Further provisions as to the borrowing of money, the application of revenue on deficiency in receipts, formation of reserve fund, the amendment of provisions as to the repayment to constituent authorities of money paid in respect of deficiencies and other financial matters.

7. The alteration of the name of the Board and of the provisions of their Acts consequential on alterations of local government areas.

Plans and sections of the intended works and plans of the lands proposed to be taken for the purposes of the Bill together with a book of reference to the plans will on or before the 30th day of November instant be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Lancaster at his office at Preston and on or before the same day a copy of so much of the said plans sections and book of reference as relates to each of the several areas hereinafter mentioned will be deposited as follows: As to the urban district of Lathom and Burscough with the Clerk to the Lathom and Burscough Urban District Council at his office at 22 Derby Street, Ormskirk; as to the rural district of West Lancashire with the Clerk to the West Lancashire Rural District Council at his office in Derby Street, Ormskirk; as to the parish of Halsall, with the clerk to the parish council of that parish at his office in Normoor Lane, Halsall; as to the parish of Aughton, with the clerk to the parish council of that parish at his office at Parrs Lane, Aughton.

WARRINGTON CORPORATION WATER.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Warrington (hereinafter called "the Corporation" and "the Borough" respectively) intend to promote a Bill in Parliament in the Session 1928-9 and that the following will be the principal subject matters of the Bill:—

1. The construction by the Corporation of waterworks in the borough and the abstraction of water from the River Mersey for the supply of water for trade and manufacturing

purposes throughout the limits of supply of the Corporation. The waterworks proposed to be authorised by the Bill will include:—

Work No. 1.—A pumping station $9\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts west of the western side of the building known as "The Old Warps."

Work No. 2.—An intake and aqueduct commencing in the right bank of the River Mersey at a point 2 chains south of Howley Foot Bridge and terminating at Work No. 1.

Work No. 3.—A sedimentation tank adjoining or near to the southern side of Work No. 1 and extending 70 yards in a southerly direction.

Work No. 4.—A filtration house and clear water tank adjoining or near to the southerly side of Work No. 1 and the westerly side of Work No. 3 and extending 70 yards in a southerly direction from Work No. 1.

Work No. 5.—A settling tank adjoining or near to the southern side of Work No. 4 and extending for a distance of 65 yards in a southerly direction from that work.

Work No. 6.—A waste water conduit commencing at Work No. 5 and terminating in Albert Terrace.

Work No. 7.—An aqueduct commencing at Work No. 1 and terminating at the junction of Liverpool Road and Milner Street.

Work No. 8.—An aqueduct commencing by a junction with Work No. 7 at the junction of Harbord Street and Parr Street and terminating at the junction of Greenall Street and Church Street.

Work No. 9.—A pumping station in enclosure 263 on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ ordnance map (1928) Lancashire CXVI.1.

Work No. 10.—An intake and aqueduct commencing in the right bank of the River Mersey at a point 1 chain south of the western end of the sluices of Howley Weir and terminating at Work No. 9.

Work No. 11.—An aqueduct commencing at Work No. 9 and terminating in the right bank of the River Mersey 1 chain north of the western end of the sluices of Howley Weir.

2. The acquisition of lands and easements in the borough for the purposes of the said work and for other purposes, the modification of the Lands Clauses Acts, the breaking up of highways, and other matters necessary for or incidental to the construction and maintenance of the said waterworks.

3. Empowering the Corporation to enter into agreements with regard to the construction of the proposed waterworks and the abstraction of water from the River with the Manchester Ship Canal Company and other parties and the enactment of conditions upon and subject to which such abstraction may take place.

4. The increase of rates and charges for the supply of water by the Corporation and the enactment of further provisions in regard to the water undertaking, including power to discharge water into streams, power to exercise the powers of a local authority under the Public Health Acts with regard to the laying of mains as if the limits of supply were "the district of the Corporation," the purchase of lands by agreement for the protection of
