Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport in exercise of the powers conferred on him by Section 10 of the aforesaid London Traffic Act has by virtue of Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made the London Traffic (Prescribed Routes) Amendment (No. 4) Provisional Regulations, 1928, amending the London Traffic (Prescribed Routes) Amendment Provisional Regulations, 1928, to come into operation on the thirteenth day of December, 1928, as Provisional Regulations to continue in force until Regulations have been made in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 11TH DECEMBER, 1928.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 80).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Further Contraction of East Sussex Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 76) as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 78) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted

for the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the Schedule to the last mentioned Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the seventeenth day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Release of East Sussex Area from Restrictions.

2. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order shall cease to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, as from the twenty-fourth day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 80).

In witness whereof the Official Seal of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries is hereunto affixed this eleventh day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

SCHEDULE.

Contracted Infected Area.

An Area comprising:—

In the county of East Sussex.

The parish of Hollington Rural;

So much of the county borough of Hastings, and so much of the parishes of Westfield, Ore, Crowhurst, and Battle as lies within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at a point where the main Battle—Hastings road adjoins the southern edge of Great Wood just north of the windmill in Battle parish, thence skirting in a generally north easterly direction the southern edge of Branshill Wood, Lower Branshill Wood, Chant Stream Wood, Whitefield Wood and Fir Wood to the point where the last mentioned wood adjoins the Sedlescombe—Hastings road; thence along that road in a southerly direction as far as its junction north of Carpenter's Barn with the road running to Westfield; thence easterly along the Westfield road via Bluemans Farm as far as the New Inn, Westfield; thence crossing the Brede—Hastings road and following a southerly course along the road past Moor Farm, and onwards via Stonestile Lane, St. Helen's Church, the Borough Cemetery, Elphinstone Road, and Queen's Road as far as the Albert Memorial, Hastings; thence following a westerly course via Robertson Street, White Rock, Eversfield Place, Grand Parade, Marina, West Marina Gardens, and Bexhill Road as far as Sheepwash Bridge; thence in a northerly and then westerly direction along the Bexhill borough boundary as far as the point where it crosses the viaduct on the Bexhill Branch of the Southern Railway; thence northerly along the said railway to the point where it is crossed by the Crowhurst—Hollington road; thence in a generally northerly direction along the said road via Crowhurst village and continuing thence along the road and along Forewood Lane in a northerly and then easterly direction to its junction at Lavington's Farm with
