WHEREAS a majority of the whole Council of the City of Sheffield on the 1st day of February, 1928, agreed to petition, and the Council of the said City thereupon petitioned His Majesty under and in pursuance of the provisions of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by Section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, and extended by the Borough Councillors (Alteration of Number) Act, 1925, for an alteration of the number of Councillors and of the number and boundaries of the Wards of the said City:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 29th day of March, 1928, to refer the said Petition to a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 13th day of July, 1928, to alter the number of Councillors of the said City of Sheffield and to order and direct that henceforth the number of the said Councillors

should be seventy-two, and further to fix the number of Wards into which the said City of Sheffield should be henceforth divided and to order and direct that the number of the said Wards should be twenty-four:

And whereas on the 26th day of July, 1928, the Right Honourable Sir William Joynson-Hicks, Bt., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State did appoint Charles Matthew Knowles, Esquire, LL.B., Barrister-at-Law, to be a Commissioner for determining the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the Wards of the said City of Sheffield:

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 28th day of January, 1929:—

“SCHEME FOR DETERMINING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE WARDS OF THE CITY OF SHEFFIELD AND APPORTIONING THE COUNCILLORS AMONG THE SAID WARDS IN PURSUANCE OF ORDERS IN COUNCIL OF 29TH MARCH, 1928, AND 13TH JULY, 1928, AND INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL AND SUPPLEMENTAL PROVISIONS.

“ I. BOUNDARIES OF WARDS.

“ In the following descriptions:—
 ‘The City Boundary’ means the boundary of the City of Sheffield as extended by the Sheffield Extension Act, 1921, and the Sheffield Corporation Act, 1928.

“ *St. Philip's Ward.*

“ A line commencing at a point in the centre of Waingate at its junction with Bridge Street, thence in a westerly direction along the centres

of Bridge Street and West Bar to the junction of West Bar and Westbar Green, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Westbar Green to its junction with Solly Street, thence in a westerly and south-westerly direction along the centre of Solly Street, to its junction with Corn Hill, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Corn Hill to its junction with Upper Allen Street, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Upper Allen Street to its junction with Mitchell Street, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Mitchell Street to its intersection with Upper St. Philip's Road, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Upper St. Philip's Road to its junction with Weston Street, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Weston Street to its junction with Powell Street, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Powell Street to its junction with Mushroom Lane, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Mushroom Lane to its junction with the north-western boundary of the Central Parliamentary Division, near Blythe Street, thence in a northerly, north-easterly, northerly, easterly, south-easterly and southerly direction following the north-western, northern and north-eastern boundaries of the Central Parliamentary Division to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" St. Peter's Ward.

" A line commencing at a point in the centre of Paternoster Row at its junction with the eastern boundary of the Central Parliamentary Division, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centres of Paternoster Row and Brown Street to the junction of Brown Street and Furnival Street, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centres of Furnival Street and Cambridge Street to the junction of Cambridge Street and Wellington Street, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Wellington Street to its junction with Fitzwilliam Street, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Fitzwilliam Street to its junction with Broomhall Street, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Broomhall Street to its junction with the western boundary of the Central Parliamentary Division, thence in a north-westerly, northerly, easterly, northerly, westerly and north-easterly direction following the western boundary of the Central Parliamentary Division to its junction with the southern boundary of St. Philip's Ward, thence eastwards following the southern boundary of St. Philip's Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the eastern boundary of the Central Parliamentary Division, thence in a southerly, south-westerly, southerly and south-easterly direction following the eastern boundary of the Central Parliamentary Division to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Moor Ward.

" A line commencing at a point in the centre of Paternoster Row at its junction with the eastern boundary of the Central Parliamentary Division, thence in a southerly, north-westerly, westerly, north-westerly and north-easterly direction following the eastern

and western boundaries of the Central Parliamentary Division to its junction with the southern boundary of St. Peter's Ward, thence in a northerly, south-easterly, easterly, south-easterly and north-easterly direction following the southern boundary of St. Peter's Ward hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Hillsborough Ward.

" A line commencing at a point in the centre of Halifax Road at its junction with the City boundary, thence in a southerly and south-westerly direction along the centre of Halifax Road to a point immediately under the centre of the London and North Eastern Railway track from Sheffield to Manchester, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of the said Railway track to its junction with the northern boundary of the Hillsborough Parliamentary Division at Wardsend Viaduct, thence in a south-easterly direction following the northern boundary of the Hillsborough Parliamentary Division to its junction with the River Don, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of the River Don to a point in the centre of Leppings Lane Bridge, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Leppings Lane to its junction with Middlewood Road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Middlewood Road to its junction with Dykes Hall Road, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Dykes Hall Road to its junction with Far Lane, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Far Lane to its junction with Dykes Lane, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Dykes Lane to its junction with Findon Street, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Findon Street to its junction with Oakland Road, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Oakland Road to its junction with Holme Lane, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Holme Lane to its junction with Stannington Road, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Stannington Road to a point in the centre of the Bridge over the River Loxley, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of the River Loxley to a point in the centre of the River Rivelin at its junction with the said River Loxley and the boundary of the Ecclesall Parish, thence in a south-westerly and westerly direction along that boundary to its junction with the City boundary at Rivelin Dams, thence northwards, eastwards, northwards and eastwards following the City boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Owlerton Ward.

" A line commencing at a point in the centre of the River Don beneath the centre of Hill-foot Bridge, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of the said River to the south-eastern boundary of Hillsborough Ward, thence in a north-westerly, southerly, north-westerly, westerly, southerly, easterly, south-easterly, westerly, and southerly direction following the south-eastern boundary of Hillsborough Ward hereinbefore described to a point in the centre of the River Rivelin immediately beneath the centre of Hollins Bridge, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Hollins Lane to its junction with Rivelin Valley Road, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre

of Rivelin Valley Road to its junction with Walkley Bank Road, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centres of Walkley Bank Road and Morley Street to the junction of Morley Street with Walkley Lane, thence southwards along the centre of Walkley Lane to its junction with Carnaby Road, thence eastwards along the centre of Carnaby Road to its junction with Hammerton Road, thence north-eastwards along the centre of Hammerton Road to its junction with Langsett Road, thence south-eastwards along the centre of Langsett Road to its junction with Burnaby Street, thence south-westwards along the centre of Burnaby Street to its junction with Freedom Street, thence eastwards along the centre of Freedom Street to its junction with Grammar Street, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Grammar Street to its intersection with King James Street, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of King James Street to its junction with Langsett Road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Langsett Road to its junction with Wood Street, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Wood Street to the point of commencement aforesaid.

“ Walkley Ward.

“ A line commencing at a point in the centre of Langsett Road at its junction with Wood Street, thence in a northerly, westerly, northerly, westerly, north-easterly, north-westerly, south-westerly, westerly, northerly and south-westerly direction following the southern boundary of Owlerton Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the eastern boundary of Hillsborough Ward, thence in a southerly direction following the eastern boundary of Hillsborough Ward hereinbefore described, to its junction with the southern boundary of the Hillsborough Parliamentary Division, thence in an easterly, north-easterly, south-easterly, north-easterly, south-easterly, north-easterly, south-easterly, north-easterly, south-easterly, northerly, easterly and northerly direction following the southern boundary of the Hillsborough Parliamentary Division to the point of commencement aforesaid.

“ Crookesmoor Ward.

“ A line commencing at a point in the centre of Howard Road at its junction with Fulton Road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Howard Road to its junction with Springvale Road, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Springvale Road to its junction with Western Road, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Western Road to its junction with School Road, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of School Road to its junction with Glebe Road, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Glebe Road to its junction with Redcar Road, thence southwards along the centre of Redcar Road to its junction with Crookesmoor Road, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Crookesmoor Road to its junction with Roslin Road, thence westwards along the centre of Roslin Road to its junction with Crookes Road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Crookes Road to its junction with Whitham Road, thence in a north-easterly

direction along the centre of Whitham Road and Western Bank to the junction of Western Bank and Mushroom Lane, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Mushroom Lane to its junction with the eastern boundary of the Hallam Parliamentary Division, thence in a north-easterly, northerly, easterly, south-easterly, north-westerly, south-westerly, southerly, westerly, southerly, north-westerly and south-westerly direction following the eastern and northern boundaries of the Hallam Parliamentary Division to the point of commencement aforesaid.

“ Broomhill Ward.

“ A line commencing at a point in the centre of Crookes Road at its junction with Roslin Road, thence in a westerly direction along the centres of Crookes Road and Lydgate Lane to the junction of Lydgate Lane and Tipton Crescent Road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Tipton Crescent Road to its junction with Ryegate Road, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Ryegate Road to its junction with Tipton Hill Road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Tipton Hill Road to its junction with Manchester Road, thence north-westwards along the centre of Manchester Road to its junction with Selborne Road, thence westwards along the centre of Selborne Road to its junction with Sandycroft Road, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Sandycroft Road to its junction with Pitchford Lane, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Pitchford Lane to its junction with Carsick View Road, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Carsick View Road to its junction with Carsick Hill Road, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Carsick Hill Road to its junction with Snaithing Lane, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Snaithing Lane to its junction with Storth Lane, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Storth Lane to a point immediately beneath the centre of the arch carrying Stumperlowe Crescent Road over Storth Lane, thence in an easterly direction along the centres of Stumperlowe Crescent Road and Graham Road to the junction of Graham Road and Hangingwater Road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Hangingwater Road to its junction with Oakbrook Road, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Oakbrook Road to its junction with the southern boundary of the Hallam Parliamentary Division, thence in an easterly direction following the southern and eastern boundaries of the Hallam Parliamentary Division to the junction with the western boundary of Moor Ward, thence north-westwards and north-eastwards following the western boundary of Moor Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the southern boundary of St. Peter's Ward, thence westwards, northwards and westwards following the western boundary of St. Peter's Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the south-eastern boundary of Crookesmoor Ward, thence in a south-easterly, south-westerly and northerly direction following the southern boundary of the Crookesmoor Ward hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"Hallam Ward.

"A line commencing at the junction of the southern boundary of Walkley Ward with the eastern boundary of Hillsborough Ward, thence westwards following the southern boundary of Hillsborough Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the City boundary, thence following the City boundary in a westerly, southerly, westerly, south-westerly, south-easterly, south-westerly, south-easterly, north-easterly, south-easterly and north-easterly direction to its junction with the southern and western boundaries of the Ecclesall Parliamentary Division, thence in a north-easterly and easterly direction following the western and northern boundaries of the Ecclesall Parliamentary Division to the junction with the southern boundary of Broomhill Ward, thence in a westerly, north-westerly and north-easterly direction following the western and northern boundaries of Broomhill Ward hereinbefore described to the junction with the western boundary of Crookesmoor Ward, thence in a northerly direction following the western boundary of Crookesmoor Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the southern boundary of Walkley Ward, thence westwards following the southern boundary of Walkley Ward hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"Sharrow Ward.

"A line commencing at a point on the eastern boundary of the Ecclesall Parliamentary Division in the centre of the River Sheaf beneath London Road Bridge, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of London Road to its junction with Chippinghouse Road, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Chippinghouse Road to its junction with Crescent Road, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Crescent Road to its junction with Kenwood Park Road, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Kenwood Park Road to its junction with Kenwood Road, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Kenwood Road to its junction with Cemetery Road, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Cemetery Road to its junction with Frog Walk, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Frog Walk to its junction with the southern boundary of Broomhill Ward, thence in a north-easterly, northerly, easterly and southerly direction following the southern boundary of Broomhill Ward hereinbefore described and the southern and western boundaries of Moor Ward hereinbefore described to the junction of the western boundary of Moor Ward with the western boundary of the Park Parliamentary Division, thence south-westwards following the eastern boundary of the Ecclesall Parliamentary Division to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"Nether Edge Ward.

"A line commencing at a point on the eastern boundary of the Ecclesall Parliamentary Division in the centre of the River Sheaf beneath London Road Bridge, thence in a northerly, westerly, northerly and north-westerly direction following the south-western boundary of Sharrow Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the southern boundary of Broomhill Ward, thence in a

westerly direction following the southern boundary of Broomhill Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with Brocco Bank, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Brocco Bank to its junction with Ecclesall Road, thence in a south-westerly and southerly direction along the centre of Ecclesall Road to its junction with Brincliffe Edge Road, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Brincliffe Edge Road to its junction with Sandford Grove Road, thence in an easterly and north-easterly direction along the centre of Sandford Grove Road to its junction with Marden Road, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Marden Road to its junction with Abbeydale Road, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Abbeydale Road to its junction with Broadfield Road, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Broadfield Road to its junction with the eastern boundary of the Ecclesall Parliamentary Division, thence in a north-easterly direction following the eastern boundary of the Ecclesall Parliamentary Division to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"Ecclesall Ward.

"A line commencing at a point on the northern boundary of the Ecclesall Parliamentary Division in the centre of the Porter Brook beneath Brocco Bank, thence in a westerly and south-westerly direction following the southern boundary of Broomhill Ward and the eastern boundary of Hallam Ward hereinbefore described to the junction with the City boundary, thence in a south-easterly and north-easterly direction following the City boundary to its junction with the western boundary of the Park Parliamentary Division, thence in a north-easterly direction following the western boundary of the Park Parliamentary Division to its junction with the southern boundary of Nether Edge Ward, thence in a westerly, south-westerly, westerly and northern direction following the southern and western boundaries of the Nether Edge Ward hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"Neepsend Ward.

"A line commencing at the junction of the eastern boundary of Hillsborough Ward with the City boundary on the north at a point in the centre of Halifax Road, thence in a southerly and south-easterly direction following the eastern boundaries of the Hillsborough, Owlerton, Crookesmoor and St. Philip's Wards hereinbefore described to a point in the centre of the River Don beneath the centre of Corporation Street Bridge, thence in a northerly direction following the western boundary of the Brightside Parliamentary Division to a point in the centre of Elm Lane, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Elm Lane to its junction with the public footpath leading from Elm Lane to Ecclesfield, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of the said public footpath to its intersection with the City boundary, thence in a westerly direction following the City boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"Burngreave Ward.

"A line commencing at a point in the centre of the River Don beneath the centre of East

Coast Road Bridge, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centres of East Coast Road and Carwood Road to the junction of Carwood Road and Lyons Street, thence in a westerly direction along the centres of Lyons Street and Lyons Road to the junction of Lyons Road with Malton Street, thence south-westwards along the centre of Malton Street to its junction with the public footpath leading from Malton Street to Melrose Road, thence north-westwards and south-westwards along the centre of the said footpath to its junction with Melrose Road, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Melrose Road to its junction with the eastern boundary of Neepsend Ward, thence southwards following the eastern boundary of Neepsend Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the north-eastern boundary of St. Philip's Ward, thence south-eastwards following the north-eastern boundary of St. Philip's Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the northern boundary of the Park Parliamentary Division, thence eastwards following the northern boundary of the Park Parliamentary Division to its junction with the western boundary of the Attercliffe Parliamentary Division, thence eastwards and northwards following the western boundary of the Attercliffe Parliamentary Division to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Firth Park Ward.

" A line commencing at a point in the centre of Deep Lane at its junction with the City boundary, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Deep Lane, Common Road, Bellhouse Road, Windmill Lane and Hinde House Lane to the junction with the public footpath leading from Hinde House Lane to Owlet Lane, thence in a southerly and south-easterly direction along the centre of the said public footpath and Owlet Lane to the junction of Owlet Lane and Upwell Street, thence westwards along the centre of Upwell Street to its junction with Upwell Hill, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Upwell Hill to its junction with Earl Marshal Road, thence eastwards and southwards along the centre of Earl Marshal Road to its junction with Grimesthorpe Road, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Grimesthorpe Road to its junction with Botham Street, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Botham Street to its junction with Carlisle Road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Carlisle Road to its junction with Carlisle Street East, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Carlisle Street East to its junction with the northern boundary of Burngreave Ward, thence in a westerly direction following the northern boundary of Burngreave Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the eastern boundary of Neepsend Ward, thence in a northerly direction following the eastern boundary of Neepsend Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the City boundary, thence in a north-easterly, northerly and easterly direction following the City boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Brightside Ward.

" A line commencing at a point in the centre of Deep Lane at the junction of the eastern

boundary of Firth Park Ward with the City boundary, thence in a southerly direction following the eastern boundary of Firth Park Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the northern boundary of Burngreave Ward, thence in a south-easterly direction following the north-eastern boundary of Burngreave Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the south-eastern boundary of the Brightside Parliamentary Division, thence in a north-easterly direction following the south-eastern and eastern boundaries of the Brightside Parliamentary Division to its junction with the City boundary, thence in a north-westerly direction following the City boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Tinsley Ward.

" A line commencing at a point in the centre of the River Don beneath the centre of Hawke Street Bridge on the boundary of Brightside Ward, thence in a north-easterly direction following the eastern boundary of Brightside Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the City boundary, thence eastwards, southwards and westwards following the City boundary to its junction with the eastern boundary of the Attercliffe Parliamentary Division, thence in a north-westerly direction following the eastern boundary of the Attercliffe Parliamentary Division to the northern corner of Tinsley Park Cemetery, thence in a south-westerly direction following the north-western boundary of the said Cemetery and continuing in a westerly direction along the centre of Barleywood Road to its junction with Greenland Road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Greenland Road to its junction with Coleford Road, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Coleford Road to its junction with Coleridge Road, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Coleridge Road to its junction with Henson Street, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Henson Street to its junction with Clement Street, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Clement Street to its junction with Century Street, thence north-eastwards along the centre of Century Street to its junction with Coleridge Road, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Coleridge Road to its junction with Attercliffe Common, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Attercliffe Common to its junction with Milford Street, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Milford Street to its junction with Dunlop Street, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Dunlop Street to its junction with Janson Street, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centres of Janson Street and Hawke Street to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Darnall Ward.

" A line commencing at a point in the centre of the London and North Eastern Railway track from Woodbourn Junction to Aldham Junction at its junction with the south-western boundary of the Attercliffe Parliamentary Division at Woodbourn Junction, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of the said Railway track to its junction with the south-western boundary of Tinsley Ward, thence in a south-easterly,

south-westerly, south-easterly, easterly, south-erly, easterly, northerly, and north-easterly direction following the south-western bound-ary of Tinsley Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the eastern boundary of the Attercliffe Parliamentary Division, thence in a south-easterly, southerly, westerly, southerly and north-westerly direction following the eastern and southern boundaries of the Attercliffe Parliamentary Division to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Attercliffe Ward.

" A line commencing at a point in the centre of the River Don beneath the centre of Hawke Street Bridge at its intersection with the eastern boundary of Brightside Ward, thence in a south-westerly, southerly and westerly direction following the eastern boundaries of Brightside and Burngreave Wards hereinbefore described to the junction of the boundary of Burngreave Ward with the northern bound-ary of the Park Parliamentary Division, thence southwards and eastwards following the northern boundary of the Park Parliamentary Division to its junction with the western boundary of Darnall Ward, thence in a north-easterly direction following the western boundary of Darnall Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the western boundary of Tinsley Ward, thence in a north-westerly, north-easterly, north-westerly, south-westerly and north-westerly direction following the western boundary of Tinsley Ward hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Manor Ward.

The Minister of Health gives notice in pursuance of the above-named Regulations that he hereby recognises each of the Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the Schedules hereto as evidence that the meat to which it relates has been derived from an animal which was free from disease at the time of slaughter and has been dressed or prepared and packed with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health.

The recognition is subject to the conditions set out in the headings to the schedules, and where the certificate is in the form of a label the recognition applies only if the label is securely affixed to the meat or to the package containing the meat and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate.
