

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 23RD FEBRUARY, 1929.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1929 (No. 13).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Contraction of Cambridge Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1929 (No. 11) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the First Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the first day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

Contraction of Widnes (Lancs.) Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

2.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1929 (No. 12) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Second Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the third day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

Revocation of certain Orders.

3. The Orders described in the Third Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked on

the first day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1929 (No. 13).
