WEST HANTS ELECTRICITY (EXTENSION) (SPECIAL ORDER).

NOTICE is hereby given that West Hampshire Electricity Company Limited (hereinafter called "the Company") whose registered office is situate at 25, Victoria Street, in the City of Westminster, have applied to the Electricity Commissioners under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1926, for a Special Order (hereinafter called "the Order") for all or some of the following objects (that is to say):—

1. To extend the area of supply under the West Hants Electricity Special Order, 1928 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1928") and the West Hants Electricity (Extension) Special Order, 1928, so as to include therein the rural district of Alresford and the rural district of Droxford (except the parish of Hambledon) and the parishes of Stoke Park, Fair Oak, Owslebury, Morestead, Avington, Itchen Abbas and Martyr Worthy, in the rural district of Winchester all in the County of Southampton, hereinafter referred to as "the added area."

2. To authorise the Undertakers to generate, store, distribute, sell and supply electrical

energy for all or any public or private purposes as defined in the said Acts and to exercise all powers usually conferred on distributors of electricity within the added area.

3. To incorporate with the Order all or some of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, with or without modifications and to extend and make applicable to the added area with or without modification all or some of the provisions of the Order of 1928.

4. To make provisions as to the price which may be charged by the Undertakers for electricity supplied in the added area.

5. To confer upon the Undertakers the powers or some of the powers contained in the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1926, and the enactments incorporated therewith and to alter vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order, and to confer other rights and privileges.

6. To authorise the Company to break up in the added area streets and parts of streets not repairable by the local authority and railways.
