- 2. In the case of female workers:-
 - (a) All employment on a Sunday.
 - (b) All employment on any other day in excess of 8 hours.

For the purpose of this Order, employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and ending on the Saturday before the first Sunday in November and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the remainder of the year.
