WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Commission dated the 4th day of December, 1928, to nominate and appoint Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., His Royal Highness The Duke of York, K.G., K.T., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., the Most Reverend Father in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right Honourable Douglas McGarel, Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any three of them, during His Majesty's illness, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas the General Council of Medical Education and Registration of the United Kingdom has, in pursuance of Section 8 of the University of Bristol Act, 1909, and Section 10 of the Medical Act, 1886, made a

Representation to the Lords and others of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council that it is expedient that the fees for attendance and travelling expenses payable under Section 12 of the Medical Act, 1858, of the Representative of the University of Bristol on the said General Council should be paid from the funds of the said General Council or of the Branch Council for England:

And whereas the Lords and others of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council have caused the said Representation to be laid before both Houses of Parliament and no Address has been presented to His Majesty against such Representation:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to such Representation:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Duke of York, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission, have taken the said Representation into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf, order, and it is hereby ordered, that the fees for attendance and travelling expenses of the Representative of the University of Bristol as a Member of the said General Council payable under Section 12 of the Medical Act, 1858, shall henceforth be paid from the funds of the General Council or of the Branch Council for England.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Arthur Lewin in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

At about 8.45 p.m. on the 18th October, 1928, Lewin was closing the gates at Pelham Street Level Crossing at Lincoln to permit an engine and two vans to cross. He had closed the large gates on the east side of the crossing, and was moving to close the wicket gate on the same side when he saw an old man open the wicket gate and start to walk across the railway lines. The man disregarded the warning shouted by Lewin, who, seeing the danger, ran across the lines and tried to pull him clear of the engine which was then moving at about five miles per hour. Unfortunately, Lewin, who is himself 67 years of age, was just too late, and not only was the old man knocked down and killed, but Lewin himself sustained serious injuries, which have resulted in the amputation of one of his arms.

PROPOSAL TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS NEWLY BROUGHT WITHIN THE SCOPE OF THE TRADE BOARD IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 18 OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909, BY THE MINISTER OF LABOUR AND DATED 21ST APRIL, 1927.

The Tin Box Trade Board (Great Britain) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO FIX Minimum Rates of Wages for Male and Female workers newly brought within the scope of the Trade Board by the Trade Boards (Tin Box Trade, Great Britain) (Constitution and Proceedings) Regulations, 1928.

Particulars of the proposed Minimum Rates may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Board.

In accordance with Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal to Fix, which may be lodged with them within two months from the 12th March, 1929. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary, Tin Box Trade Board (Great

His Majesty The KING has been pleased, upon the recommendation of the President of the Board of Trade, to award the Bronze Medal for Gallantry in Saving Life at Sea to Mr. John William Harris, First Mate, Mr. Stephen Corner Stephenson Taws, Second Mate, and Reginald Thistle Forster, Percy Arthur Walker, and Arthur William Rouse, Quartermasters and A.B.'s, formerly of the s.s. "City of Lahore," of Liverpool, in recognition of the gallantry displayed by them on the 30th October, 1927, in saving the lives of the crew of the Newfoundland schooner "Selma Creaser," which was in distress in the Atlantic Ocean.

The Silver Medal for Gallantry in Saving Life at Sea (Foreign Services) has also been awarded, on the recommendation of the President of the Board of Trade, to a number of Icelanders in recognition of the gallant services rendered by them on 20th and 21st March, 1928, when they rescued the crew of the steam trawler "Max Pemberton" of Hull, which stranded on the Icelandic Coast on 20th March, 1928.

The award has also been approved of the Silver Medal for Gallantry in Saving Life at Sea to William Arthur James, fireman of the British s.s. "Trojanstan."

A fire broke out in the stoke-hold of the vessel on the 12th October, 1928, and a number of the crew were unable to make their escape from the engine room. James with commendable gallantry and at considerable risk, closed the door of the pump room in which was stored a large quantity of oil fuel. This action prevented the fire spreading and was the means of preventing serious loss of life.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1929 (No. 16).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Contraction of Lincolnshire Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1929 (No. 14) shall be read

and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

Commencement and Short Title.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, and may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1929 (No. 16).
