Francfort. Dec. 11. The German Troops that are de-figued to Garifon Philipibourg, Brifack, and Fribourg, lie canconed in the Villages, and in a readiness to march, but the Reench have not yet let any time for evacuating those Places.

Paris, Dec. 11. The Balls and Entertainments on occasion of the Duke of Burgandy's Marriage, have been continued for several days. The Prince. of Conti's safe return has caused much Joy here; He landed on the 10th at Dunkirke. Monsieur de Harlay arrived here on the 8th from his Embally in Holland. Monsieur Vauban, Principal Ingenier, is going to Germany, with Orders to Fortifie the French frontier Places. On the 11th was Registred in the Parliament of Paris, the Kings new Declaration, by which he forbids all his Subjects, of what Quality or Condition soever they may be; to go and settle in the Principality of Orange, commands such as are now there, to return to his Dominions within 6 months; and prohibits all his Subjects to perform any Exercise of the Resormed Religion in the said Principality, to contract any Marriages, or to send their Children thither to be Christned.
