tages and the values at which they are to be reckoned shall be as follows:—

1. Cottage: A cottage, including any garden provided with the cottage, 3s. per week, less any rent or rates paid by the occupier. Provided that in the case of a cottage with regard to which the Committee on an application by or on behalf of a worker have certified that by reason of inadequate accommodation, want

of repair or sanitation or lack of water supply, the value of such cottage is less than 3s. per week, the value shall be such sum less than 3s. per week as the Committee shall determine on a consideration of the defects.

2. Milk: New milk 2d. per pint. Skimmed or separated milk, 1d. per pint.

3. Board and lodging (excluding intoxicants).

# ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 27TH MARCH, 1929.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

### Authorisation of Landing of Animal for Exceptional Purposes.

1. The landing of the animal described in the First Schedule hereto, which is intended for exceptional purposes, is hereby allowed subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

#### Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the detention of the animal described in the First Schedule hereto.

### Examination before Landing.

3. No such animal as aforesaid shall be landed except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animal has been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

## Regulations applicable to the Animal on Landing.

4. The animal on being landed, shall forthwith be moved from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animal shall be kept separate from all other animals and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

In witness whereof the Official Seal of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries is hereunto affixed this twenty-seventh day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.
