WHEREAS by sub-section 3 of Section one of the Reorganisation of Offices (Scotland) Act, 1928, it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council make such incidental, consequential and supplemental provisions, and such adaptations in the enactments relating to any powers and duties transferred to a Department under that section, as may be necessary or expedient for the purpose of giving full effect to the transfer of such powers and duties, and of making them exercisable by the Department and the officers thereof:

And whereas the Secretary of State for Scotland has appointed the first day of April, 1929, as the day on which the powers and duties of the Prison Commissioners for Scotland will be transferred to and vested in a Prisons Department for Scotland:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Commission dated the 4th day of December, 1928, to nominate and appoint Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of

Wales, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., His Royal Highness The Duke of York, K.G., K.T., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., the Most Reverend Father in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right Honourable Douglas McGarel, Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any three of them, during His Majesty's illness, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission, in pursuance of the said section of such Act and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Prisons Department for Scotland (Consequential Provisions) Order, 1929.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2.—(1) The statutory provisions set forth in the first and second columns of the Schedule to

this Order shall be modified by the substitution for the words set forth in the third column of the words set forth in the fourth column thereof.

(2) The expression "authorised officer" wherever occurring in the fourth column of the Schedule means an officer authorised in

accordance with paragraph (c) in sub-section (5) of Section 1 of the Reorganisation of Offices (Scotland) Act, 1928.

3. This Order shall come into operation and take effect on and from the first day of April, 1929.

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. In each of the three Forms of Voting Paper in the Second Schedule to the said Regulations, the words “ (*In the case of a man*) ” and the words “ (*In the case of a woman*) ” that I have not voted at this general election for any other university constituency ” shall be omitted.

2. This Order may be cited as the University Elections (Single Transferable Vote) Amending Order, 1929, and shall come into operation on the first day of May nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

And whereas by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty The King has power and jurisdiction, in relation to His Majesty's subjects and others, within the dominions of His Majesty the Sultan of Morocco:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Morocco (Amendment) Order in Council 1929.

(2) This Order shall be construed as one with the Morocco Order in Council 1889 (hereinafter called "the Principal Order") as amended by the Morocco Order in Council 1914, and the Morocco (Amendment) Order in Council 1921.

(3) A copy of the Principal Order with the amendments, whether by way of substitution, addition or omission, required by the Morocco Order in Council 1914, the Morocco (Amendment) Order in Council 1921, and by this Order and in the form of an Order consolidating the said Orders made on the date of this Order and intitled the "Morocco Orders in Council 1889-1929 Consolidated," shall be prepared and certified by the Secretary of State, and copies of the Morocco Orders in Council 1889-1929 Consolidated shall be printed in accordance with the copy so certified, containing the certificate of the Secretary of State as aforesaid printed at the heading thereof, which certificate shall recite the provisions of this Article, and such copies may hereafter, except in regard to matters covered by Article 2 (2) of this Order, be exclusively referred to for all purposes connected with the exercise of jurisdiction by His Majesty in Morocco.

2.—(1) This Order shall come into force on the 1st May 1929.

(2) No provision of this Order amending or repealing any provision of any previous Order shall affect the past operation of such previous Order or of any King's Regulation, rule, or any enactment made thereunder, or of any appointment made or any right, title, obligation or liability, civil or criminal, accrued, or the validity or invalidity of anything done or suffered under such previous Order before the coming into force of this Order.

(3) Certified printed copies of this Order and copies of the Morocco Orders in Council 1889-1929 Consolidated, printed as provided in Article I (3) of this Order, shall forthwith be affixed and exhibited conspicuously in the public offices of His Majesty's Consul-General at Rabat and His Majesty's Consul at Tetuan.

(4) Proof shall not be required in any proceeding or matter that the provisions of the preceding paragraph of this Article have been complied with, nor shall any failure to comply with the said provisions in any manner affect the operation of this Order.

3. Article 4 of the Principal Order is hereby repealed and the following Article shall be substituted therefor:—

"4. In the construction of this Order the following words and expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant thereto, that is to say,

(i) "Morocco" or the expression "the limits of this Order" means any portion of the dominions of His Majesty the Sultan of Morocco including the territorial waters appertaining thereto in which His Majesty The King exercises jurisdiction for the time being;

(ii) "The Secretary of State" means one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State;

(iii) "The Consul-General" means, in and so far as concerns the French Zone of Morocco or any matter appertaining thereto, His Majesty's Consul-General at Rabat for the time being, and, in and so far as concerns the Spanish Zone of Morocco and any matter appertaining thereto, His Majesty's Consul at Tetuan for the time being, including a person acting temporarily, with the approval of the Secretary of State, as or for those officers either generally or for the purpose of performing their judicial functions;

(iv) "Consular officer" means a Consul-General, Consul, Vice-Consul, or Consular Agent of His Majesty resident in Morocco, including a person acting temporarily, with the approval of the Secretary of State, as and for any of those officers either generally or for the purpose of performing their judicial functions;

(v) "Commissioned Consular officer" means a Consular officer, not being merely a Consular Agent, and holding a commission from His Majesty, including a person acting temporarily, with the approval of the Secretary of State, as or for such a Consular officer;

(vi) "Superintending Consul" means a commissioned Consular officer having, by virtue of his commission or appointment or by authority of the Secretary of State, either generally or for all or any of the purposes of this Order, superintendence over any other Consular officer;

(vii) "Uncommissioned Consular officer" means a Consular officer not holding such a commission, including a person acting temporarily, with the approval of the Secretary of State, as or for such a Consular officer;

(viii) "Consulate" and "Consular office" refer to the Consulate and office

of a Consular officer; "Consulate-General" refers to the Consulate and office of the Consul-General;

(ix) "Consular district" means the district in and for which a Consular officer usually acts, or for which he may be authorised to act, for all or any of the purposes of this Order by authority of the Secretary of State;

(x) "British subject" means any person who is at any time a British subject in accordance with the provisions of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914;

(xi) "British protected person" means a person properly enjoying His Majesty's protection in Morocco;

(xii) "Resident" means having a fixed place of abode in Morocco;

(xiii) "Moorish subject" means a subject of His Majesty the Sultan of Morocco;

(xiv) "Foreigner" means a subject or citizen of a State in amity with His Majesty other than Morocco;

(xv) "The Supreme Court of Gibraltar," or "the Supreme Court" means the Supreme Court of His Majesty's garrison and territory of Gibraltar;

(xvi) "The Court for Morocco" or "the Court," means the Court established by this Order; and "the Court" also includes the Supreme Court or a Judge thereof acting in Morocco;

(xvii) "Offence" includes crime, and any act punishable criminally in a summary way or otherwise;

(xviii) "Prosecutor" means complainant or any person appointed or allowed by the Court to prosecute;

(xix) "Month" means calendar month;

(xx) "Pounds" means pounds sterling;

(xxi) "Will" means will, codicil, or other testamentary instrument;

(xxii) "Administration" means (unless a contrary intention appears from the context) letters of administration, including the same with will annexed, or granted for special or limited purposes;

(xxiii) "Paper" includes deed, memorandum, or other document;

(xxiv) "Ship" includes any vessel used in navigation, howsoever propelled, with her tackle, furniture, and apparel, and any boat or other craft;

(xxv) "Office copy" means a copy, either made under direction of the Court, or produced to the proper officer of the Court for examination with the original, and examined by him therewith, and in either case sealed with the seal of the Court, as evidence of correctness;

(xxvi) "Oath" and "Affidavit," and words referring thereto, or to swearing, include affirmation and declaration, and refer thereto, or to the making of an affirmation or declaration, where an affirmation or declaration is admissible in lieu of an oath or affidavit;

(xxvii) "Proved" means shown by evidence on oath, in the form of affidavit, or other form, to the satisfaction of the Court, or of the member or officer thereof acting or having jurisdiction in the matter;

(xxviii) "Proof" means the evidence adduced in that behalf;

(xxix) "Person" includes any body corporate or incorporate;

(xxx) Words importing the plural or the singular may be construed as referring to one person or thing, or to more than one person or thing, and words importing the masculine as referring to females (as the case may require);

(xxxi) Where this Order refers to any specified Act or Acts of Parliament, such reference shall, unless a contrary intention appears, be deemed to include any Act or Acts amending or substituted for the same."

4. Article 5 of the Principal Order is hereby repealed and the following Article substituted therefor:—

"5.—(1) The jurisdiction hereby conferred shall extend to the persons and matters following, in so far as by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, or other lawful means His Majesty has jurisdiction in relation to such persons and matters, that is to say:—

(i) All persons within the limits of this Order who are British subjects or British protected persons or who are otherwise subject to His Majesty's jurisdiction in Morocco (hereinafter described as persons subject to this Order).

(ii) The property and all personal and proprietary rights and liabilities within the said limits, of any British subjects, British protected persons or persons otherwise subject to His Majesty's jurisdiction in Morocco, whether such persons are within the said limits or not.

(iii) Moorish subjects in the cases specified in this Order.

(iv) All other persons who submit themselves to the jurisdiction in accordance with this Order and who give such security as the Consular Court requires for obedience to the order of the Court.

(v) British ships with their boats and the property on board thereof, being within the limits of this Order.

(2) Crimes, offences, wrongs, and breaches of contract affecting the person, property or rights of persons not subject to this Order, are punishable or otherwise cognizable under the provisions of this Order, with the consent of the persons whose person, property or rights are affected, in the same manner as if they affected the person, property or rights of persons subject to this Order."

5. Paragraphs (5) and (6) of Article 7 of the Principal Order are hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

"(5) The jurisdiction of the Court shall, for and within each Consular district, be exercised according to the provisions of this Order and to any directions of the Secretary of State by the Consular officer for that district, provided that (i) nothing in this Article shall debar a Superintending Consular officer from exercising jurisdiction in any part of his district although another Consular officer may also be empowered to exercise jurisdiction therein; (ii) a Superintending Consular officer may, by writing,

authorise any Consular officer under his superintendence (including an officer placed temporarily under his superintendence for this purpose) to exercise jurisdiction in any place in the district of such Superintending Consular officer."

6. Article 12 of the Principal Order is hereby repealed and the following Article substituted therefor:—

"12.—(1) Notwithstanding anything in this Order, the Court for Morocco shall not, nor shall by virtue of this Order the Supreme Court for Gibraltar, exercise any jurisdiction in any proceeding whatsoever over the Consul-General or over his official or other residences or his official or other property.

(2) Notwithstanding anything in this Order the Court for Morocco shall not, nor shall by virtue of this Order the Supreme Court, exercise, except with the consent of the Consul-General, signified in writing, any jurisdiction in any proceeding over any person attached to or being a member of or in the service of the Consulate-General.

(3) If in any case under this Order it appears to the Court for Morocco or to the Supreme Court that the attendance of the Consul-General or any person attached to or being a member of or in the service of the Consulate-General to give evidence before the Court or Supreme Court is requisite in the interests of justice, the Court for Morocco or the Supreme Court (as the case may be) may address to the Consul-General a request in writing for such attendance.

(4) A person attending to give evidence before the Court or Supreme Court shall not be compelled or allowed to give any evidence or produce any document if, in the opinion of the Consul-General signified by him personally or in writing to the Court or to the Supreme Court, the giving or production thereof would be injurious to His Majesty's service."

7.—(1) Article 34 of the Principal Order shall be amended by the addition of the words "in such cases and" after the words "Consul-General" in paragraph (1) thereof.

(2) Article 38 of the Principal Order shall be amended by the addition of the words "or British protected person" after the words "British subject" in paragraphs (1) and (2) thereof.

(3) All references in the Principal Order to the Foreign Jurisdiction Act 1843 or to the Foreign Jurisdiction Act 1875 or any sections thereof shall be amended by substituting therefor references to the Foreign Jurisdiction Act 1890 and to the corresponding sections thereof.

(4) Article 41 of the Principal Order shall be amended by the substitution of the words "subject to this Order" for the words "subject to the criminal jurisdiction of the Court" in paragraph (1) thereof, and by the addition of the words "or if, having given the security, he fails during the continuance of the security to keep the peace or be of good behaviour as the case may be," after the words "fails to do so" in paragraph (3) thereof.

8. The following provisos shall be added to Article 45 of the Principal Order:—

"Provided that (1) in all matters relating to marriage, inheritance and other questions

involving religious law and custom, the Court shall, in the case of persons belonging to non-Christian communities, recognise and apply the religious law and custom of the person concerned; (2) where no evidence is offered to the contrary or where, upon the evidence before the Court the Court is unable to determine the domicile of any person subject to this Order and not of African or Asiatic descent, such person may be presumed to be domiciled in England."

9. The following provisos shall be added to Article 81 of the Principal Order:—

"Provided that, notwithstanding anything in Articles 81 to 91 inclusive of this Order, the Court shall not exercise the jurisdiction conferred by these articles (1) in any case where the deceased was at the time of his death a Moorish subject; nor (2) in any other case where the deceased belonged at his death to a non-Christian community, except where an application is made to the Court by any person having a lawful interest in the matter."

10.—(1) Article 82 of the Principal Order shall be amended by striking out the word "personal" in paragraph (1) thereof wherever it occurs.

(2) Article 85 of the Principal Order is hereby repealed and the following article substituted therefor:

"85. Where a British subject or British protected person dies in Morocco or elsewhere intestate, then, until administration is granted, his property in Morocco shall be deemed to be vested in the Consul-General."

(3) Article 86 of the Principal Order shall be amended by striking out the word "personal" in paragraph (2) thereof.

(4) Article 87 of the Principal Order shall be amended by striking out the word "personal" in paragraph (1) and in paragraph (2) thereof.

(5) Article 89 of the Principal Order shall be amended by the insertion of the words "leaving property" after the word "dies" and before the words "in Morocco" in paragraph (1) thereof.

(6) Article 90 of the Principal Order shall be amended by striking out the word "personal" in paragraph (7) thereof.

11.—(1) Article 92 of the Principal Order shall be amended by the substitution of the words "the Court for Morocco" for the words "the Consul-General" in paragraph (1) (i) and (ii) thereof.

(2) Article 93 of the Principal Order shall be amended by the substitution of the words "two months" for the words "three months" in paragraph (1) thereof, and the words "three months" for the words "six months" in paragraph (2) thereof.

12. Article 94 of the Principal Order shall be amended by the substitution of the words "the Court for Morocco" for the words "the Consul-General" wherever the latter words occur in the said Article and by the substitution of the words "the Court" for the word "he" in paragraph (1) thereof.

13. Article 97 of the Principal Order shall be amended:—

(1) by substituting the words "the Court for Morocco" for the words "the Consul-

General" and by the omission of the words "by him" in paragraph (2) thereof.

(2) by substituting the words "the Court for Morocco" and "itself" for the words "the Consul-General" and "himself" respectively in paragraph (3) thereof.

14.—(1) Article 106 of the Principal Order shall be amended by the substitution of the words "the Consul-General" for "Her Majesty's Minister" in paragraph (1) thereof, and of the words "a person subject to this Order" for "a British subject in Morocco" in paragraph (2) thereof.

(2) Article 1 of the Morocco Order in Council 1914 shall be deemed to be Article 109 of the Morocco Orders in Council 1889-1929 Consolidated.

(3) Article 112 of the Principal Order shall be amended by (a) the substitution of the words "person subject to this Order" for the words "British subject" wherever they occur except in the last line thereof and (b) by the deletion of the words "Any statute amending or substituted for any of the above mentioned statutes" and (c) by the substitution of the following for the first proviso thereof

"(1) That a copy of any such Statute or Order in Council shall be available for inspection in the public office of the Consulate-General."

15. Article 115 of the Principal Order shall be amended by the addition of the words "or in any Court or before any judicial officer exercising jurisdiction in the Tangier Zone of Morocco, as defined in the first schedule to the Morocco (Tangier Zone) Order in Council 1924," after the words "in amity with His Majesty" in paragraph (1) thereof.

16. Article 118 of the Principal Order shall be amended by striking out the words "Taxes and other charges on British subjects" in paragraph (8) thereof.

17. Article 124 of the Principal Order shall be amended by the addition at the end of the said article of the words "and authorising the Court to cause service to be made of writs and other processes of a civil or commercial character on behalf of other tribunals whether situated in Morocco or not, and if outside Morocco whether situated in His Majesty's Dominions or in any foreign state in amity with His Majesty."

18. The last paragraph of Article 136 of the Principal Order is hereby repealed.

19.—(1) Article 137 of the Principal Order is hereby repealed.

(2) The following article is hereby enacted and shall be deemed to be Article 137 of the Morocco Orders in Council 1889-1929 Consolidated:

"137. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any King's Regulation which has been or may be made under Article 143 of this Order, or in any Regulation which is or may be under Article 109 of this Order made binding upon persons subject to this Order, such King's Regulation or Regulations shall be deemed to mean that British subjects and British protected persons contravening them shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the maximum penalty provided therein, and the Court for Morocco

shall not be bound to enforce any provision whereby any minimum penalty is imposed."

20.—(1) Article 141 of the Principal Order is hereby repealed and the following article substituted therefor:

"141. In any case in which under the provisions of this Order any jurisdiction or judicial function, which is not given to any other member of the Court for Morocco, is to be or may be exercised or performed by the Consul-General, he shall for that purpose have all the powers which the Court for Morocco has in relation to any cause, matter or proceeding, and, unless otherwise expressly provided by this Order, there shall be no appeal from his determination except to His Majesty in Council and then only by special leave of His Majesty in Council."

(2) Article 144 of the Principal Order shall be amended by the addition of the words "Protectorate or Mandated Territory" after the word "settlement" and the deletion of the word "or" before the word "settlement."

And the Right Honourable Sir Joseph Austen Chamberlain one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State is to give the necessary directions herein.

And whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 14th day of March,

1929, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Edyth, Sea Mills, situate in the Parish of Henbury, in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Bristol:

“ Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Edyth, Sea Mills, situate as aforesaid:

“ Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Bristol (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Henbury which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Edyth, Sea Mills, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘ The District Chapelry of Saint Edyth, Sea Mills ’.

“ And with the like consent of the said George, Bishop of Bristol (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Edyth, Sea Mills, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being. Provided always that so long as the Reverend John Collins Lloyd, Clerk in Holy Orders, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Henbury, shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent, all the fees or dues which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization or performance at the said Church of Saint Edyth, Sea Mills, situate as aforesaid, shall be paid over by the Minister thereof to the said John Collins Lloyd.

“ We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

“ The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“ The District Chapelry of Saint Edyth, Sea Mills, being:—

“ All that part of the Parish of Henbury, in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Bristol, which is bounded upon the west by the Parish of Shirehampton, in the said

County and Diocese, upon the south west by the Parish of Abbots Leigh, in the County of Somerset and in the said Diocese of Bristol, upon the south east by the New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Stoke Bishop, in the said County of Gloucester and in the said Diocese of Bristol, upon the east partly by the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Stoke Bishop, and partly by the Parish of Westbury upon Trym, in the said County of Gloucester and in the said Diocese of Bristol, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Westbury upon Trym from the said Parish of Henbury at the centre of the bridge which carries Dingle Road across the River Trym, and extending thence northward along the middle of Dingle Road for a distance of 4½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Sylvan Way and Westbury Lane, and extending thence first northward, then westward and then southward along the middle of Westbury Lane for a distance of 51 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Stoke Bishop to King’s Weston and with the road leading through Shirehampton Park to Shirehampton, and extending thence westward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 35 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Henbury from the said Parish of Shirehampton.”

And whereas the said Representation has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Commission:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorized thereto by His Majesty’s said Commission, have taken the said Representation into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty’s Privy Council, on His Majesty’s behalf, ratify the same and order, as it is hereby ordered, that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And do hereby, by and with the like advice, direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bristol.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF ASSISTANT EXAMINER IN THE PATENT OFFICE, DEPARTMENT OF THE BOARD OF TRADE.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future examinations.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 20 and 25, and candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the examination.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz. :—

(a) Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

(b) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and the children of fathers also natural-born British subjects; provided that exception may be made :—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted

with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916 to 1918, exemption from service in His Majesty's Forces under those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of military service, or, although not so exempted, declined to comply with obligations imposed upon him by those Acts.

4. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried or widows, and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

5. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

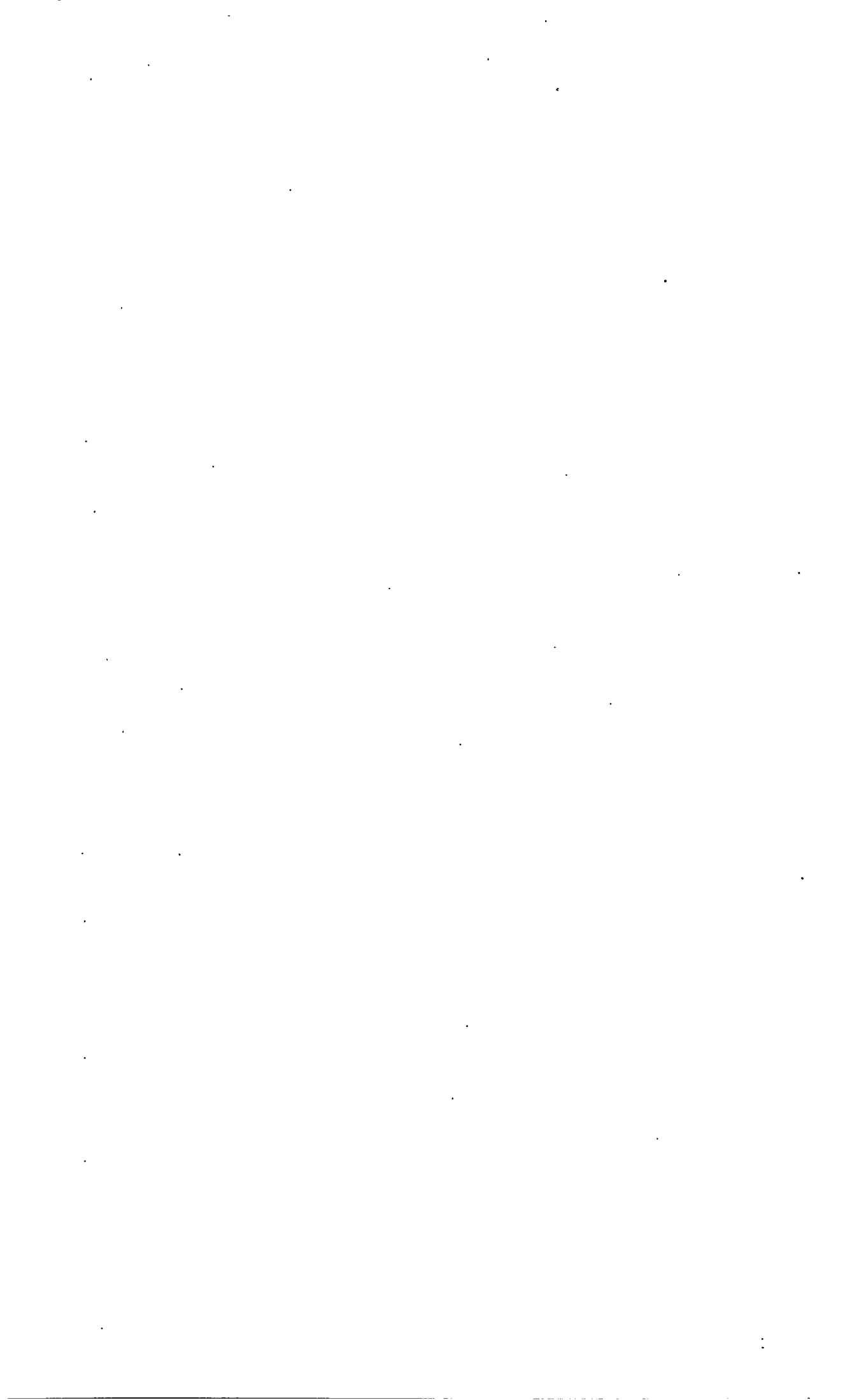
