The KING has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal to present The Rev. Hugh Maurice Herbert, B.A., to the Vicarage of Holy Trinity High Hurst Wood, in the County of Sussex and Diocese of Chichester, void by the resignation of the last Incumbent and in His Majesty's Gift for this turn only by reason of the late avoidance of the See of Canterbury.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 26th April, 1929, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 29th April, 1929, to Saturday, the 4th May, 1929, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

THE CORONERS (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1926.
ORDER FOR THE ALTERATION OF CORONERS'
DISTRICTS.

Whereas on the 26th day of April, 1927, a vacancy occurred in the Office of Franchise Coroner for the Manor and Liberty of Hungerford;

And whereas by the operation of Section 4 of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, the area over which the Franchise Coroner for the said Manor and Liberty of Hungerford had jurisdiction thereupon became merged in the County of Berks for all purposes relating to Coroners;

And whereas the County of Berks is at present divided into five Coroners Districts, and it is necessary to alter the existing division of the County so as to include the said Manor and Liberty of Hungerford in one of such districts;

And whereas the Berkshire County Council have pursuant to Section 12 of the said Act and to the Coroners (Orders as to Districts) Rules, 1927, submitted to the Secretary of State a draft Order providing for the alteration of the existing division of the County of Berks into Coroners districts so as to include in one of those districts the area of the Manor and Liberty of Hungerford;

Now, therefore, I, the undersigned, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the power vested in me by Section 12 of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, do hereby order that the existing division of the County of Berks into Coroners' districts, shall be altered and that the said districts shall be named and constituted as set out in the Schedule hereto and substituted for the existing districts.

This Order shall come into operation on the first day of February, 1928.

Whereas by the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, it is provided that the right of any person having power to appoint a franchise coroner shall cease on the next vacancy in the office which occurs after the passing of that Act and for all purposes relating to coroners the area in which the franchise coroner had jurisdiction shall thereupon, if and so far as it is not situated in a Borough the Council of which have power to appoint a Borough Coroner, be merged in the County.

And whereas on the 31st day of May, 1927, a vacancy in the office of franchise coroner for the Hundred of Christchurch and of the Liberty of Westover in the County of Southampton occurred:

And whereas the said County is divided into Coroners' Districts:

COUNTY OF WILTS.

THE CORONERS (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1926.

ORDER FOR THE ALTERATION OF CORONERS' DISTRICTS.

Whereas it is provided by section 4 of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, that the right of any person having power to appoint a

franchise coroner shall cease on the next vacancy in that office which occurs after the passing of that Act, and that for all purposes relating to coroners the area in which the franchise coroner had jurisdiction shall thereupon, if and so far as it is not situated in a borough the Council of which have power to appoint a borough coroner, be merged in the County; and that where the area in which a franchise coroner had jurisdiction is merged in a County which is divided into coroners' districts, any consequential alteration of the division of the County into coroners' districts shall be effected in manner provided by the said Act.

And whereas it is provided by section 12 of the said Act that a County Council may submit to the Secretary of State a draft Order providing for such alteration of any existing division of the County into coroners' districts as appears to them to be suitable, and that the Secretary of State after taking into consideration any objections to the draft Order, made in the prescribed manner and within the prescribed time, may make an Order, either in the terms of the draft submitted to him, or with such modifications as he thinks fit.

And whereas by an Order in Council made on the 16th April, 1923, and coming into operation on the 1st May following, the division theretofore made of the County of Wilts for Coroners' purposes and for the purposes of the Coroners' Act, 1844, was altered, and the said County was thereby divided into two Coroners' Districts namely the First or North Wilts Coroners' District comprising the area mentioned in Part I of the Schedule to the said Order, and the Second or South Wilts Coroners' District comprising the area mentioned in Part II of the said Schedule.

And whereas there was excepted from the area comprised in the First or North Wilts Coroners' District the Liberty of the Manor of Corsham being an area for which a franchise coroner was appointed by the Court Leet of the said Manor,

And whereas the appointment of the said Coroner for the Liberty of Corsham was made annually at the Court Baron of the said Manor, and a vacancy has occurred in the Office of the said Coroner after the passing of the said recited Act, and thereupon the right to appoint a coroner for the said Liberty ceased by virtue of section 4 of the said recited Act, and the area of the said Liberty of Corsham became merged in the said County,

And whereas the County Council pursuant to section 12 of the said recited Act have submitted to the Secretary of State a draft Order for the alteration of the First or North Wilts Coroners' District,

And whereas the requirements of the Coroners (Orders as to Districts) Rules, 1927, made under section 12 of the said recited Act have been complied with,

Now therefore in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Section 12 of the said recited Act I hereby order as follows, that is to say:

The First or North Wilts Coroners' District as constituted by the said recited Order in Council of the 16th April, 1923, shall as from the date of this Order be altered by the inclusion in the said District of the Liberty of the Manor of Corsham.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACTS, 1920-1928.

DECISION OF THE HIGH COURT ON A REFERENCE BY THE MINISTER OF LABOUR, PURSUANT TO SECTION 10 (1), PROVISO (ii), OF THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT, 1920.

Contributions payable.

On the 26th March, 1929, Mr. Justice Roche gave judgment in the High Court on a question referred by the Minister for decision:—

whether the employment of a person as a carpenter and general estate and farm repairer on a private estate

was, or was not, such employment as to make that person an employed person within the meaning of the Unemployment Insurance Acts, 1920-1928.

The Judge held that the employment of the person in question was not "Employment in agriculture including horticulture and forestry," and, accordingly, was not excepted under paragraph (a) of Part II of the First Schedule to the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920. Contributions were, therefore, payable in respect of the employment.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the award of the Albert Medal to No. Ply/21668 Marine Albert Ernest Richards for gallantry in saving life.

The following is the account of the services in respect of which the decoration has been conferred:—

On the 25th September, 1928, blasting operations were in progress for the removal of rock on a site at St. Helena under the charge of No. Ply/14790 Sergeant Stewart Symons. Four charges had been laid, two in drilled holes and two in crevices in the rock. The drilled hole fuzes were each to be lit by a Marine and the crevice fuzes by Sergeant Symons. The hole fuzes and the upper crevice fuze were lit simultaneously, and the Sergeant was bending down to light the lower crevice fuze when the charge in the upper crevice exploded unexpectedly, blinding Sergeant Symons and knocking him helpless close to one of the drilled holes. The Marines who had lit

the other fuzes had by this time run clear, but Marine Richards, seeing that the Sergeant was disabled, turned back and helped him to his feet and dragged him clear of the subsequent explosions from the effects of which he shielded him with his own body.

Marine Richards was well aware that at least two further charges were due to explode within some thirty seconds, and his presence of mind and disregard of personal danger undoubtedly saved Sergeant Symons from death.

Notices and Advertisements paid for by cheque will not be inserted until such cheques have been cleared.

Notices of Dissolution of Partnership will not be inserted unless signed by the Partners named therein, or by their legal representatives; and the signature or representative character of the signatory must be verified by Statutory Declaration made by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.

A Notice of Dissolution of Partnership not signed by all the Partners, or their legal representatives, must be accompanied by a Statutory Declaration made by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court to the effect that such notice is given in pursuance of the terms of the partnership to which it relates.

Advertisements purporting to be issued in pursuance of Statutes or under Orders of Court will not be inserted unless signed or attested by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.

Advertisements relating to Bills before Parliament will not be inserted unless signed by a Parliamentary Agent or a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.
