FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACTS, 1901 to 1929.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on the 27th April, 1929, he made Regulations under Section 1 of the Factory and Workshop (Cotton Cloth Factories) Act, 1929, to apply to all factories in which is carried on the weaving of cotton cloth. These Regulations, which may be cited as the Cotton Cloth Factories Regulations, 1929, will come into force on the 15th May, 1929, from which date the Regulations under the Factory and Workshop (Cotton Cloth Factories) Act, 1911, will be repealed.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in toffee boiling and chocolate coating at the works of Messrs. Dunn & Co. (Sunderland) Ltd., Burn Park, Sunderland, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable cloakroom and messroom accommodation, washing facilities and facilities for

sitting shall be provided; and that the Secretary of State may at any time require the occupiers to make such special arrangements for the conveyance of workers living at a distance or otherwise for the welfare of such workers as may be necessary to prevent hardship.
