

Bishop of Salisbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Overton with Fyfield is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Olympia Agricultural Company Limited and the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Avebury with East Kennett now belongs as to two turns in every three turns of presentation or nomination to Elizabeth Davis, wife of the Reverend William Henry Davis, of Lower Brixham Vicarage, Brixham, in the County of Devon, and as to the third or remaining turn to the Bishop of Salisbury:

"And whereas it was one of the terms of the before-mentioned Report to the said Bishop of Salisbury that after the union of the said Benefices of Overton with Fyfield and East Kennett the Patronage of the United Benefice should belong as to the first and third of every three successive turns of presentation to the said Olympia Agricultural Company, Limited, and as to the second turn to the Bishop of Salisbury but the said Olympia Agricultural Company, Limited, are desirous that their right or interest as Patrons of the the said Benefice of Overton with Fyfield in the Patronage of such United Benefice shall be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Salisbury for the time being to the intent that the Patronage of such United Benefice shall belong wholly to the See of Salisbury:

"And whereas the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of Patronage hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of the said Benefice of Overton with Fyfield hereinafter recommended and proposed to be united to the said Benefice of East Kennett:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Overton with Fyfield, Avebury with East Kennett, and Winterbourne Monkton with Berwick Bassett, are now full, the Reverend Herbert William Workman being the present Incumbent of the said Benefices of Overton with Fyfield and Avebury with East Kennett, and the Reverend Robert Stephenson Weallens being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Winterbourne Monkton with Berwick Bassett and the said Benefice of Winterbourne Bassett is now vacant:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions of Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report to the Bishop of Salisbury, and, fur-

ther, for effecting such transfer of Patronage as is hereinbefore mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent, so far as the transfer of Patronage hereinafter recommended is concerned, of the said Olympia Agricultural Company, Limited (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common Seal to be affixed hereto) and with the consent, both as to the said transfer of Patronage and as to the unions of Benefices and all other recommendations of this Scheme, of the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Overton with Fyfield and that part of the said United Benefice of Avebury with East Kennett which consists of the said Benefice of East Kennett shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Overton and Fyfield with East Kennett' but that the Parishes of the said Benefices of Overton with Fyfield and East Kennett shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That the part of the said United Benefice of Avebury with East Kennett which consists of the said Benefice of Avebury and the part of the said United Benefice of Winterbourne Monkton with Berwick Bassett which consists of the said Benefice of Winterbourne Monkton shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Avebury with Winterbourne Monkton' but the Parishes of the said Benefices of Avebury and Winterbourne Monkton shall continue distinct in all respects.

"3. That the part of the said United Benefice of Winterbourne Monkton with Berwick Bassett which consists of the said Benefice of Berwick Bassett and the said Benefice of Winterbourne Bassett shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Winterbourne Bassett with Berwick Bassett' but the Parishes of the said Benefices of Winterbourne Bassett and Berwick Bassett shall continue distinct in all respects.

"4. That with the consent of the said Herbert William Workman (testified by his signing this Scheme) upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme shall forthwith take effect and the said Herbert William Workman if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefices of Overton with Fyfield and Avebury with East Kennett shall cease to be Incumbent of those Benefices and shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Overton and Fyfield with East Kennett.

"5. That with the consent of the said Robert Stephenson Weallens (testified by his signing this Scheme) if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices of Winterbourne Monkton with Berwick Bassett and Winterbourne Bassett shall be vacant the unions referred to in Clauses 2 and 3 of this
