WHEREAS We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to dissolve this present Parliament which stands prorogued to Friday, the Twenty-fourth day of May instant; We do, for that End, publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby dissolve the said Parliament accordingly: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are discharged from their Meeting and Attendance on the said Friday, the Twenty-fourth day of May instant: And We being desirous and resolved, as soon as may be, to meet Our People, and to have their Advice in Parliament, do hereby make known to all Our loving Subjects Our Royal Will and Pleasure to call a new Parliament: And do hereby further declare, that, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, We have given Order that Our Chancellor of Great Britain and Our Governor of Northern Ireland do respectively, upon Notice thereof, forthwith issue out Writs, in due Form and according to Law, for calling a new Parliament: And we do

hereby also, by this Our Royal Proclamation under Our Great Seal of Our Realm, require Writs forthwith to be issued accordingly by Our said Chancellor and Governor respectively, for causing the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons who are to serve in the said Parliament to be duly returned to, and give their Attendance in, Our said Parliament on Tuesday, the Twenty-fifth day of June next, which Writs are to be returnable in due course of Law.

A PROCLAMATION

IN ORDER TO THE ELECTING AND SUMMONING THE
SIXTEEN PEERS OF SCOTLAND.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS We have in Our Council thought fit to declare Our pleasure for summoning and holding a Parliament of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, on Tuesday, the Twenty-fifth day of

June next ensuing the date hereof: In order, therefore, to the electing and summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland who are to sit in the House of Peers in the said Parliament, We do, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at the Palace of Holyroodhouse, in Edinburgh, on Friday, the Thirty-first day of May instant, at Twelve o'clock Noon, to nominate and choose the Sixteen Peers to sit and vote in the House of Peers in the said ensuing Parliament by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the Proxies of such as shall be absent (such Proxies being Peers, and producing a Mandate in Writing duly signed before Witnesses, and both the Constituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law); and the Lord Clerk Register and the Principal Clerk of the Session appointed by him to officiate in his name, are hereby respectively required to attend such Meeting, and to take the Votes of the said Peers, and immediately after such Election made and duly examined to certify the Names of the Sixteen Peers so elected, and to sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers the Electors, and return such Certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain: And We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly command and require the Lord Provost of Edinburgh, and all other the Magistrates of the said City, to take especial care to preserve the Peace thereof during the time of the said Election, and to prevent all manner of Riots, Tumults, Disorders, and Violence whatsoever: And We strictly charge and command that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the County Towns of Scotland, Ten Days at least before the Time hereby appointed for the Meeting of the said Peers to proceed to such Election.

And whereas His Majesty, by virtue of the authority conferred on Him by the Copyright Act, 1911, 1-2 G. 5, c. 46, and having regard to the provisions of the revised Berne Copyright Convention of 1908, was pleased to make an Order in Council, dated the 24th day of June, 1912, S.R. & O. 1912 (No. 913), p. 48 (hereinafter called the Principal Order), extending the protection of the said Act to certain classes of works to which protection is guaranteed by the said Convention; including works of which the country of origin is Portugal or Spain:

And whereas the accession of the Republic of Portugal to the said Convention applied also to the Portuguese Colonies and the ratification of the said Convention by Spain applied to all territories dependent on the Spanish Crown:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission in exercise of the powers conferred upon them in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf are pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

(1) The Principal Order shall extend to the Portuguese Colonies and to the Spanish Colonies as if those Colonies were amongst the Foreign Countries therein named, subject to the following modifications:

(a) The provisions of Article (2), proviso (iii) (a) shall apply as if the said Colonies were included amongst the Foreign Countries named in those provisions.

(b) In the application of the provisions of Article (3) of the Principal Order to works of which the country of origin is any of the said Colonies the date of this Order shall be substituted for the Commencement of the Act and for the Commencement of the Principal Order.

(c) In the application to such works of Sections 1 (2) (d) and 19 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the Commencement of the Act and for the passing of the Act in Sections 19 (7) and 19 (8) wherever those expressions occur.

(d) In the application to such works of Section 24 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the Commencement of the Act wherever that expression occurs in Subsection (1) (a), and for the 26th July, 1910, in Subsection (1) (b).

2. This Order may be cited as the Berne Copyright Convention (Portuguese Colonies and Spanish Colonies) Order, 1929.

And the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury are to give the necessary orders accordingly.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Eling, in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Eling is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Florence Rosina Bladon, of the Manor House, Magham Down, Hailsham, in the County of Sussex, Widow:

"And whereas the said Florence Rosina Bladon is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presenta-

tion to the said Benefice of Eling, now vested in her as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Winchester for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Frank Theodore, now Bishop of Winchester, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said Frank Theodore, Bishop of Winchester, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Eling, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Eling:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Florence Rosina Bladon (in testimony whereof she has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Frank Theodore, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Eling now vested in her, the said Florence Rosina Bladon as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Frank Theodore, Bishop of Winchester, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Frank Theodore, Bishop of Winchester, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Commission:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorized thereto by His Majesty's said Commission have taken the said Scheme into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf, ratify the same and order, as it is hereby ordered, that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Sevenhampton and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Charlton Abbots, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Gloucester:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report (*inter alia*) upon the union of the said two Benefices of Sevenhampton and Charlton Abbots, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Gloucester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Gloucester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices

based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Sevenhampton is now full the Reverend Arthur Charles Norton being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Charlton Abbots is at present vacant:

"And whereas the said Arthur Charles Norton has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Sevenhampton and the said Benefice of Charlton Abbots shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Sevenhampton with Charlton Abbots' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Cheltenham but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Arthur Charles Norton if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Sevenhampton shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Sevenhampton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Sevenhampton shall have the first and the third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Charlton Abbots shall have the second turn.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Gloucester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Commission:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission have taken the said Scheme into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf, affirm the said Scheme and order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

“And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 14th day of May, 1912, and published in the London Gazette on the 17th day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint George, South Moor, situate within the limits of the New Parish of Holmside, in the said County and Diocese, and such Consolidated Chapelry was named ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint George, South Moor’:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Anselm, Hayes, situate in the Parish of Hayes, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Anselm, Hayes, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Hayes, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Anselm, Hayes, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Anselm, Hayes'.

"We, Frank Theodore, Bishop of Winchester, in pursuance of the twenty-sixth Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

"There is in the County of Hants and our Diocese of Winchester the Vicarage or Benefice of Romsey the Parish whereof contains a population according to the last Census of six thousand and five hundred or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for one thousand five hundred persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Romsey is four hundred and ten pounds or thereabouts.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Rectory or Benefice of Nursling the Parish whereof contains a population according to the last Census of six hundred and sixty-one or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for two hundred persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Nursling is six hundred and twenty-one pounds or thereabouts.

"A certain portion of the said Parish of Romsey (being the well defined district known

as Lee) with a total population of sixty or thereabouts is distant about two and a half miles from the Parish Church of Romsey and one mile from the Parish Church of Nursling.

"It appears to us and we do hereby represent to Your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, the said portion of the Parish of Romsey known as the District of Lee which is more particularly delineated on the plan annexed to the Scheme appended to this Representation and thereon verged pink may be advantageously separated therefrom and annexed to the said Parish of Nursling to which it is contiguous.

"We, the said Frank Theodore, by virtue of our Bishopric are the Patron of the said Benefices of Romsey and Nursling the Reverend William Henry Birch Corban being the present Incumbent of Romsey and the Reverend Joseph Gillibrand being the present Incumbent of Nursling.

"Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, we, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction Glebe lands Tithe rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect of Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we do hereby submit the same to Your Grace together with our consent in writing as Patron of both of the said Benefices of Romsey and Nursling and also the Consents of the Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed:—

"1. That there be separated from the Ecclesiastical Parish of Romsey and annexed to the Parish of Nursling a certain portion of the said Parish of Romsey being the well defined district known as Lee which lies to the north of the said Parish of Nursling the boundaries of which district are delineated on the plan annexed hereto and thereon verged pink.

"2. That the Incumbent of Nursling shall have sole and exclusive cure of souls within such district so to be separated from Romsey and annexed to Nursling.

"3. That the inhabitants of such district shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Nursling but shall cease to be entitled to any right of accommodation in the Parish Church of Romsey excepting nevertheless any such inhabitants or inhabitant (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said Parish Church of Romsey who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"4. That the inhabitants of the aforesaid district shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the said Parish Church of Nursling as but for the said separation they might have had in the Parish Church of Romsey.

"5. That all Tithes Tithe rent charges fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said district so to be separated from the Parish of Romsey and annexed to Nursling shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Nursling who shall have all such rights and remedies for enforcing payment of the same as are now or would in the future but for the said separation be exercisable by the Incumbent of the Benefice of Romsey.

"6. That no alteration except as aforesaid shall be made in the endowments of the said Benefices or either of them.

"7. That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.

There is in the County of Gloucester and our Diocese of Gloucester the Perpetual Curacy or Chapelry of Rangeworthy, the Parish whereof contains an estimated present population of about two hundred and seventy. The net annual value of the Benefice arising from Tithe Rentcharge Grants from the Ecclesiastical Commissioners and Queen Anne's Bounty and fees and other sources is Three hundred and twenty-one pounds or thereabouts. The Parish Church of Holy Trinity Rangeworthy contains one hundred and fifty sittings.

"2. There is also in the same County and Diocese the Rectory of Wickwar containing an estimated present population of about seven hundred and sixty-nine. The net annual value of this Benefice arising from Tithe Rentcharge Grants from the Ecclesiastical Commissioners and Queen Anne's Bounty Glebe Lands fees and other sources is Five hundred and twenty-one pounds or thereabouts. The Parish Church of Holy Trinity Wickwar contains four hundred sittings.

"3. The said Parish of Wickwar includes the Hamlet of Bagstone which adjoins the said Parish of Rangeworthy and is delineated and coloured pink on the plan annexed to the Scheme appended to this Representation.

The said Hamlet of Bagstone is bounded by the Parishes of Rangeworthy, Tytherington and Cromhall and the Ladden Brook on all parts or sides thereof and contains thirty houses or thereabouts the number of its estimated present population being one hundred or thereabouts. The centre of the said Hamlet of Bagstone is about three quarters of a mile distant from the Parish Church of Holy Trinity Rangeworthy aforesaid and about three and a half miles from the Parish Church of Holy Trinity Wickwar aforesaid.

"4. It appears to us that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act the said Hamlet known as Bagstone may advantageously be separated from the said Rectory of Wickwar and annexed to the said Perpetual Curacy or Chapelry of Rangeworthy.

"5. The Perpetual Curacy or Chapelry of Rangeworthy is in the Patronage of the Reverend Claud Rutledge Cotter, Master of Arts Vicar of the Parish of Thornbury in the said County and Diocese of Gloucester. The Rectory of Wickwar is in the Patronage of the Right Honourable Capel Henry Berkeley Moreton Earl of Ducie.

"6. The Reverend Ponsonby Augustus Moore Sullivan, Master of Arts is the present Incumbent of the Perpetual Curacy or Chapelry of Rangeworthy. The Reverend Thomas Arthur Garnett Master of Arts is the present Incumbent of the Rectory of Wickwar.

"7. Pursuant to the directions contained in the Twenty-sixth Section of the said Pluralities Act we the said Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the portion of the said Rectory of Wickwar proposed to be annexed to the said Perpetual Curacy or Chapelry of Rangeworthy and the mode in which it appears to us the alterations may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction Glebe Lands Tithe Rentcharges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect of Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, and we do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the Consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents by your Report to His Majesty in Council.

"That all fees dues and ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said portion of the said Rectory of Wickwar so as aforesaid to be annexed to the said Perpetual Curacy or Chapelry of Rangeworthy shall belong to the Incumbent of the said Perpetual Curacy or Chapelry of Rangeworthy.

"That no alterations shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.

"That no alterations shall be made in the Endowments of the said Benefices or either of them."

That it appears to the said Archbishop that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament passed in the session holden in the 1st and 2nd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria Chapter 106 and of the 2nd and 3rd years of the same reign the said chapelry of Fraisthorpe may be advantageously separated from the said Vicarage of Carnaby and be united to the said Rectory of Barmston for ecclesiastical purposes.

That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the aforesaid first mentioned Act the said Archbishop has prepared a Scheme in writing appended to this Report describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alterations above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction Glebe lands Tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect of Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satis-

fied with such Scheme he doth by this report to Your Majesty in Council certify the same to Your Majesty together with the consents in writing of the Patrons of the Benefices to be affected to the intent that Your Majesty in Council in case it shall be thought expedient and proper so to do may make an Order for carrying the same into effect.
