

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in the conversion of prepared cheese into portions at the Works of Messrs. Nestlé & Anglo-Swiss Condensed Milk Co., Aylesbury, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable cloakroom accommodation, facilities for preparing, cooking and taking meals, washing facilities and seats shall be provided; and that a responsible forewoman shall be charged with the supervision of the women and young persons employed in each shift.

TOY MANUFACTURING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR A CERTAIN CLASS OF MALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 21st April, 1927, the Toy Manufacturing Trade Board (Great Britain) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY the Minimum Rates of Wages for Male Wood Cutting Machinists.

Particulars of the proposed variation may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board.

In accordance with Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will CONSIDER ANY OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 14th day of May, 1929. It is desirable that Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.
