Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Margaret, Leigh on Sea.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Henry Albert, Bishop of Chelmsford and his successors, Bishops of Chelmsford, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any

other Act of Parliament.

THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Margaret, Leigh on Sea, being:—

" All that part of the Parish of Leigh, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, which is bounded upon the west by the Parish of Hadleigh, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north, upon the east and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Hadleigh from the said Parish of Leigh at the point where such boundary crosses the middle of Prittle Brook and extending thence first eastward and then south eastward along the middle of Prittle Brook for a distance of 1 mile and 15 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries the road known as Kingswood Chase across Prittle Brook, and extending thence southward along the middle of Kingswood Chase for a distance of 12½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with London Road and the road known as Southsea Avenue, and extending thence southward along the middle of Southsea Avenue for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road known as Ronaldhill Grove, and extending thence westward along the middle of Ronaldhill Grove for a distance of 42 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road known as Fairleigh Drive, and extending thence southward along the middle of Fairleigh Drive for a distance of 141 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road known as Glendale Gardens, and extending thence westward along the middle of Glendale Gardens for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road known as Westcliff Drive, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Westcliff Drive for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hadleigh Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Hadleigh Road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Western Road,

and extending thence first north westward and then westward along the middle of Western Road for a distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Harley Street, and extending thence southward along the middle of Harley Street for a distance of 12½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road known as Marine Parade, and extending thence in a straight line due south for a distance of 1112 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the London, Tilbury and Southend Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 53 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Leigh from the said Parish of Hadleigh."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-before mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the Parish of Leigh out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved at the Council held under the autho-

rity of the said Commission:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission have taken the said Scheme into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf, ratify the same and order, as it is hereby ordered, that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And do hereby, by and with the like advice, direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of

Chelmsford.
