

in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right Honourable Douglas McGarel, Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any three of them, during His Majesty's illness, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas the Most Reverend William, Lord Archbishop of York, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Report to His Majesty in Council, in the following terms:—

"1. That there is in the County and Diocese of York the Vicarage of Hutton Buscel the Parish of which comprises amongst other places the District of Wrench Green the boundaries whereof are well known and are delineated on the plan annexed hereto and are thereon edged round with green.

"2. That according to the last census the population of the said Parish of Hutton Buscel exclusive of the said District of Wrench Green amounts to about Seven hundred persons and that of the said District to Sixty persons.

"3. That the said District of Wrench Green is situated at a distance of Eight miles or thereabouts from the Parish Church of Hutton Buscel aforesaid.

"4. That there is in the said County and Diocese of York also the New Vicarage of Hackness the Parish Church whereof is at a distance of only One mile from the said District of Wrench Green.

"5. That the Church of the said Parish of Hackness is capable of affording accommodation to the inhabitants of the said Parish of Hackness and of the said District of Wrench Green.

"6. That the Patronage of the said Vicarage of Hutton Buscel is vested in the Right Honourable William Charles de Meuron Earl Fitzwilliam, K.C.V.O., C.B.E., D.S.O., and the Reverend Lewis Arthur Drakeford-Lewis, Master of Arts, is the present incumbent thereof and the Patronage of the said New Vicarage of Hackness belongs to the Right Honourable Francis Baron Derwent of Hackness in the said County of York and the Reverend William Norman Blake is the present incumbent thereof all of whom are consenting parties to the separation and annexation contemplated by the scheme hereafter proposed.

"7. That it is proposed by the present Scheme that from and after the next avoidance of the said Vicarage of Hutton Buscel the Corn Rents belonging to that Benefice amounting to the sum of twelve pounds five shillings and fivepence and charged on lands situated within the said District of Wrench Green proposed to be so transferred as aforesaid as more particularly set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed shall be transferred to the Benefice of Hackness aforesaid as and for and in aid of the maintenance and benefit of the Incumbent thereof.

"8. That it appears to the said Archbishop that, under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament passed in the Session holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her late

Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, and of the second and third years of Her late Majesty's reign, Chapter 49, the said District of Wrench Green may be advantageously separated from the Benefice of Hutton Buscel and be annexed to the said Benefice of Hackness for ecclesiastical purposes.

"9. That pursuant to the direction contained in the 26th Section of the said first mentioned Act the said Archbishop has prepared a Scheme in writing appended to this report describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration above proposed may be best effected and the said Archbishop being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with such Scheme he doth by this Report to Your Majesty in Council certify the same to Your Majesty together with the Consent in writing to the said Scheme of the Patrons and Incumbents of the said Parishes to the intent that Your Majesty in Council in case it should be thought expedient and proper so to do may make an Order for carrying such Scheme into effect.

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Archbishop and the Consents referred to in the said Report are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"That the said District of Wrench Green edged round with green on the plan attached hereto shall be separated from the said Parish of Hutton Buscel and be annexed to the Parish of Hackness for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That the Vicar of Hackness shall have exclusive cure of souls in and over the said District so transferred.

"That the Corn Rents amounting to the sum of twelve pounds five shillings and fivepence per annum arising out of the lands within the said District of Wrench Green and belonging to the Incumbent of Hutton Buscel shall as and from the termination of the present incumbency of Hutton Buscel belong to and be received by the Vicar of the Parish of Hackness.

"That all other ecclesiastical dues fees and emoluments now receivable by the Vicar of Hutton Buscel within or in respect of the said District of Wrench Green shall henceforth belong to and be received by the Vicar of the Parish of Hackness.

"That the Patronages of the said Benefices of Hutton Buscel and Hackness shall not be altered.

"That subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rate Abolition Act, 1868, the inhabitants of the said District of Wrench Green shall be liable for the repair of the Parish church of Hackness as are the other inhabitants of the said Parish of Hackness and shall be henceforth exempt from all liability in respect of the repair and maintenance of the Parish church of Hutton Buscel.

"That the inhabitants of the said District of Wrench Green shall not henceforth be entitled to any accommodation in the Parish church or churchyard of Hutton Buscel but shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish church and churchyard of Hackness aforesaid.
