HIS MAJESTY in Council was this day pleased to declare that having been restored by the providence and mercy of Almighty God to such measure of health and strength that He had been enabled to resume the exercise of many of the functions delegated by Him to the Counsellors of State under the Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Realm dated the fourth day of December in the Nineteenth Year of His Reign and that it had been represented to Him that for the better preservation of His health and strength it is expedient that for the time being He should not resume the exercise of all the functions delegated as aforesaid, and that He should be relieved of the burden of transacting certain matters and things:

Whereupon the Draft of a Commission revoking the said Letters Patent and making provision for the transaction on behalf of His Majesty of certain matters and things more particularly specified in the Schedule annexed to the said Draft was this day read at the Board and approved; and His Majesty was further pleased to nominate Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., His Royal Highness The Duke of York, K.G., K.T., G.C.M.G.,

G.C.V.O., the Most Reverend Father in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan, the Right Honourable Sir John Sankey, G.B.E., Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable James Ramsay MacDonald, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, for the purposes therein mentioned and to declare that they should be designated under the style and title of Counsellors of State.

His Majesty was also pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Right Honourable John Robert Clynes, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do cause a Warrant to be prepared, for His Majesty's Royal Signature, for passing under the Great Seal of the Realm a Commission conformable to the said Draft which is hereunto annexed.

Now know ye that We do by these Presents revoke Our said Letters Patent; And Further Know Ye that We having entire confidence in the fidelity of Our Most dearly beloved Consort The Queen; Our Most dear and entirely beloved Son and Most faithful Counsellor Edward Albert Christian George Andrew Patrick David, Prince of Wales, Knight of Our Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight of Our Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle, Knight of Our Most Illustrious Order of Saint Patrick, Knight Grand Commander of Our Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Grand Master and Principal Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distin-guished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Commander of Our Most Eminent Order of the Indian Empire, Knight Grand Cross of Our Royal Victorian Order, Grand Master and Principal Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Excellent Order of the British Empire; Our Most dear and entirely beloved Son and Most faithful Counsellor Albert Frederick Arthur George, Duke of York, Knight of Our Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight of Our Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Cross of Our Royal Victorian Order; The Most Reverend Father in God Our Right Trusty and Well beloved Counsellor Cosmo Gordon, by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan; Our Right Trusty and Well beloved Counsellor Sir John Sankey, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Our Chancellor of Great Britain; and Our Right Trusty and Well beloved Counsellor James Ramsay MacDonald, Our Prime Minister and First Lord of Our Treasury; of Our most especial grace certain knowledge and mere motion do nominate and appoint Our Said Consort The Queen and Our said Counsellors The Prince of Wales, The Duke of York, Archbishop of Canterbury, Sir John Sankey and James Ramsay MacDonald to be Our Counsellors of State until the further signification of Our Pleasure And we do by these Presents give and grant unto Our said Counsellors of State or any two of them full power and authority from henceforth until the further signification of Our Pleasure

to approve and sign on Our behalf any of the documents specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed and further to do on Our behalf any of the other matters and things specified in the said Schedule; save only that they Our said Counsellors of State shall not without Our special approval sign any Warrant Commission or other writing or instrument or act in any of the aforesaid specified matters or things in regard to which it is signified by Us or appears to them that Our special approval should be previously obtained and We further direct that until the further signification of Our Pleasure these Presents shall take effect notwithstanding the death or incapacity of any one or more of Our said Counsellors of State so long as two of them remain capable of acting thereunder.

1. Peers, Bishops, His Majesty's Lieutenants of Counties, Deputy Lieutenants of Counties, Members of Parliament, Officials connected with the Houses of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all gentlemen other than those mentioned in the following Regulations, should communicate with the Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace. No applications can be received from gentlemen in the foregoing categories wishing to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the gentleman making the presentation.

2. All gentlemen referred to in the following Regulations, wishing to attend or be presented at a Levée, should make a written application

as directed below.

3. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty.

4. All Officers on the active, retired, and reserve lists of the Regular Army, the Militia, and the Territorial Army, except Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards, and except Officers of the Indian Services and Indian Army and Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation from the Under-Secretary of State, War Office.

Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards will communicate, through their Regimental Headquarters, with the Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, to obtain their cards for

attendance or presentation.

5. All Officers on the active list of the Royal Air Force and Officers of the Special Reserve and Auxiliary Air Force will obtain their cards, for attendance or presentation, through the usual channels. Officers of the Reserve of Air Force Officers and Officers on the retired list of the Royal Air Force will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Secretary, Air Ministry, Kingsway, W.C. 2.

6. All Officers of His Majesty's Civil Service will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation from the

Department under which they serve.

7. All Officers of the Indian Services and of the Indian Army, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, for attendance or for presentation, from the Political A.D.C. to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.

8. All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the self-governing Dominions, who will apply to the Under-Secretary of State, the War Office, for their cards for attendance

or for presentation, supporting their applica-tion in all cases by a credential from the Governor-General, Governor, Officer commanding the local Forces, or the representative in London of the Dominion concerned.

For the purpose of this Clause the expression "week" shall be deemed to mean a week consisting of the following number of hours:—

- (a) During the week in which Christmas Day falls, 39\frac{1}{2}.

- 3. For the purpose of the above rates employment in "summer" shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and terminating on the last Sunday in October, and employment in "winter" shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.
- 4. For the purpose of the above rates the expression "hours of work" or "hours" shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.
- 5. The wages payable for the employment of female workers shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates:—

 - (e) All employment in excess of 50 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in any other week in summer.
 - (f) All employment in excess of 39½ hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in the week in which Christmas Day falls.
 - (g) All employment in excess of 48 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in any other week in winter.

ORDER DEFINING THE EMPLOYMENT WHICH IS TO BE TREATED AS OVER-TIME EMPLOYMENT.

The Northamptonshire and Soke of Peterborough Agricultural Wages Committee, in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Regulations made thereunder, do by this Order vary as from 17th June, 1929, their Order of 2nd March, 1925, defining the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment for the purpose of the application of any differential rate of wages for overtime employment fixed by the said Committee for the area comprising the administrative counties of Northampton and Soke of Peterborough, which for the purposes of the said Act shall be deemed to include the county borough of Northampton, so as to provide that such employment shall be as follows:

- (a) All employment in excess of 5½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not Sunday, Easter Monday, Monday, Christmas Day, or in any year in which Christmas Day falls on a Sunday, Boxing Day) in every week as may be agreed between an employer and a worker, provided that in any case overtime rates shall be paid in respect of all hours worked after 1 o'clock on such day.
- (b) All employment on a Sunday, Easter Monday, Whit Monday and Christmas Day.
- (c) In any year in which Christmas Day falls on a Sunday, all employment on Boxing Day.
- (d) All employment in excess of 41 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in the weeks in which Easter Monday and Whit Monday fall.
- (e) All employment in excess of 50 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in any other week in summer.
- (f) All employment in excess of 39½ hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in the week in which Christmas Day falls.

(g) All employment in excess of 48 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in any other week in winter.

- (g) Carting coal and firewood (fuel) for worker.
- (h) Garden manure supplied to worker.

2. Values.

(a) Milk—the wholesale price as fixed by the South Wales Area Milk Committee.

(b) Potato ground-5s. per 100 yards potato drill, the worker to supply his own seed potatoes.

(c) Cottage—maximum, 3s. per week, provided as follows:—

In the case of a cottage with regard to which the Committee, on application by or on behalf of a worker, have certified that the value of such cottage is less than 3s. per week the value shall be such sum less than 3s. per week as the Committee shall determine.
