Six Hackney Carriages:

On the South-east side of roadway, commencing at a point forty feet North-east of steps leading to District Railway Station and extending North-eastward, by kerb, as far as necessary for six carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the South-west.

13th June, 1929:-

AT WILTON ROAD AND GILL-INGHAM STREET, VICTORIA.

In Two Portions.

Ten Hackney Carriages:

First Portion. At Wilton Road, three carriages on West side of roadway, commencing at a point fifteen feet South of Exit of Victoria Station situate twenty yards North of Hudson's Place and extending Southward by kerb, as far as necessary for three carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the North.

Second Portion. At Gillingham Street, seven carriages on South side of roadway, commencing at a point fifty feet West of Western kerb line of Wilton Road and extending Westward by kerb, as far as necessary for seven carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the East.

The first portion of the Standing to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion.
